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8	An Act relating to professions and occupations;
9	amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 1684 and 1688, which relate to the Electrical License Act; establishing
10	maximum grade value and passing score; providing for retaking of exam; removing time limit for registration certificates; requiring continuing
11	education for renewal of certain licenses; requiring amendment of administrative rules; providing for
12	codification; and providing an effective date.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1684, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1684. A. Examinations for licenses as electrical
18	contractors or journeyman electricians shall be uniform and
19	practical in nature for each respective license and shall be
20	sufficiently strict to test the qualifications and fitness of the
21	applicants for licenses. Examinations shall be in whole or in part
22	in writing. The Committee shall conduct examinations twice a year
23	and at such other times as it deems necessary.
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1 B. Any applicant initially failing to pass the examination 2 shall not be permitted to take another examination for a period of thirty (30) days. Any applicant subsequently failing to pass the 3 examination shall not be permitted to take another examination for a 4 period of ninety (90) days The maximum grade value of each part of 5 any such examination shall be one hundred (100) points. A passing 6 score shall be seventy percent (70%) or higher on each part. Any 7 applicant failing to pass the examination shall not be permitted to 8 9 take another examination for a period of thirty (30) days. 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1688, is 10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 11 12 Section 1688. A. No license shall be issued for longer than one (1) year, and all licenses shall expire on the last day in the 13 birth month of the licensee. A license may be renewed upon 14 application and payment of fees thirty (30) days preceding or 15 following the date the license is due. Licenses renewed more than 16 thirty (30) days following the date of expiration may be renewed 17 only upon application and payment of all required fees and payment 18 of any penalty for late renewal established by the Board and upon 19 compliance with any applicable continuing education requirements 20 established by the Board and the Electrical License Act. No penalty 21 for late renewal shall be charged to any holder of a license which 22 expires while the holder is in military service, if an application 23

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1 for renewal is made within one (1) year following the service 2 discharge of the holder.

B. No journeyman or contractor license shall be renewed unless
the licensee has completed the required hours of continuing
education, as determined and approved by the Committee of Electrical
Examiners and approved by the Construction Industries Board.

C. An apprentice registration certificate or a student intern
registration certificate shall be issued for one (1) year, at which
time the apprentice may reregister upon meeting the requirements of
the Construction Industries Board and paying the renewal fee.

11 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1688.1 of Title 59, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1. Effective January 1, 2026, no contractor or journeyman 14 Α. license shall be renewed unless the licensee has completed twelve 15 (12) hours of continuing education every three (3) years or thirty-16 six (36) months preceding the expiration date of the license or 17 registration certificate. The continuing education course and 18 instructor shall be approved in advance by the Committee of 19 Electrical Examiners. Exceptions to advance approval, or post-20 course approval, may be allowed by the Committee, or its designee, 21 for substitute instructors in emergency situations when written 22 notice of the emergency is provided to the Committee or its designee 23 within seven (7) days of the course. The location of continuing 24

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1 education courses shall be at the discretion of the course provider 2 and may be scheduled during the workday at the discretion of the course provider. The continuing education material shall cover six 3 (6) hours of codes and revisions adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform 4 5 Building Code Commission (OUBCC). The remaining six (6) hours may include the study of: electrical circuit theory and calculations, 6 wiring methods, grounding and bonding, transformer and motor theory, 7 electrical circuits and devices, control systems, alternative energy 8 9 systems including energy storage, safety related to the electrical industry as defined by NFPA 70E, manufacturers' installation of 10 equipment or parts, the Electrical License Act, the trade 11 12 regulations as set forth in this act as well as the rules of the 13 Construction Industries Board, and other trade subject matters approved by the Committee. 14

2. Effective January 1, 2026, no apprentice shall be permitted 15 to reregister unless the apprentice registrant has completed three 16 17 (3) hours of continuing education every year preceding the expiration date of the registration certificate. The continuing 18 education course and instructor shall be approved in advance by the 19 Committee. Exceptions to advance approval, or post-course approval, 20 may be allowed by the Committee, or its designee, for substitute 21 instructors in emergency situations when written notice of the 22 emergency is provided to the Committee or its designee within seven 23 The location of continuing education 24 (7) days of the course.

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1	courses shall be at the discretion of the course provider and may be
2	scheduled during the workday at the discretion of the course
3	provider. The continuing education material shall cover a
4	combination of the codes and revisions adopted by the OUBCC,
5	Oklahoma electrical industry regulations as well as the rules of the
6	Construction Industries Board, and "electrical safety" as defined by
7	NFPA 70E, other trade subject matters approved by the Committee, or
8	approved continuing education for the contractor or journeyman.
9	Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, if an apprentice
10	is a student apprentice or is enrolled and attending an approved
11	course, the continuing education shall not be required.
12	B. The Construction Industries Board shall amend its rules,
13	wherever applicable, to conform to the provisions of the Electrical
14	License Act.
15	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
