A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1305.3 of Title 74, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 For plan years beginning on and after January 1, 2019, any 20 HealthChoice options plans offered to state and educational 21 employees under the Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits Act 22 shall also be offered to residents of the state of Oklahoma for 23 enrollment. Participation eligibility requirements, dependent 24

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coverage options and any other coverage options and criteria shall

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be determined by the Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits
Board. The Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits Board shall
promulgate administrative rules necessary to implement the
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4 provisions of this section.

- 5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 1302, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- Section 1302. It is hereby declared that the purpose of this act is:
 - (a) To provide uniformity in Accident and Health Insurance and/or Benefits Coverage and Life Insurance on all employees of the State of Oklahoma;
 - (b) To enable the state to attract and retain qualified employees by providing health, dental and life insurance benefits similar to those commonly provided in private industry;
 - (c) To recognize and protect the state's investment in each permanent employee by promoting and preserving good health and longevity among state employees;
 - (d) To recognize the service to the state by elected and appointed officials by extending to them the same health, dental and life insurance benefits as are provided herein for state employees;
 - (e) To recognize long and faithful service, and to encourage employees to remain in state service until eligible for retirement by providing health, dental and life insurance benefits for employees; and

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(f) To ensure state compliance with the Health Maintenance
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    Organization Act of 1973 pursuant to 42 U.S.C., Section 300e et
    seq.; and
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        (g) To offer health insurance plan or plans to all Oklahomans.
        SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
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
