7	An Act relating to district assessors; creating offices of district assessors; dividing state into
8	districts; abolishing offices of county assessors; transferring powers and duties; amending 19 O.S.
9	2011, Section 131, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2013 (19 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 131),
10	which relates to election of county officers; providing expiration of county assessor offices;
11	providing for election of district assessor; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Section 5-110, providing time period
12	for declaration of candidacy for district assessors for certain election; providing for codification; and
13	declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 125 of Title 19, unless there is
19	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. There is hereby created the offices of district assessors.
21	The state is hereby divided into twenty-six (26) district assessors
22	with the number of authorized districts to be the same as and have
23	identical boundaries as the district court judicial districts as
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provided in Sections 92.2 through 92.27 of Title 20 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes.

B. The offices of county assessors in each county of this state
are hereby abolished. All powers, duties, responsibilities,
property personnel, assets, liabilities, fund balances, encumbrances
and obligations of the county assessor are hereby transferred and
vested to the Office of District Assessor for their respective
county. All references made in the Oklahoma Statutes to county
assessors shall mean the district assessors.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 131, as 11 amended by Section 1, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2013 (19 O.S. Supp. 2017, 12 Section 131), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 131. A. At the general election to be held in November 14 1974, there shall be elected in each county of the state, a court 15 clerk, a county sheriff, and a county clerk who shall hold office 16 for a term of two (2) years, the terms of the court clerk, county 17 sheriff and county clerk beginning on the first Monday in January 18 following their election, and until their successors are elected and 19 qualified. At the general election to be held in November 1976, and 20 each four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected in each 21 county of the state, a court clerk, a county sheriff, and a county 22 clerk who shall hold office for a term of four (4) years; the terms 23 of the court clerk, the county sheriff and the county clerk,

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beginning on the first business day in January following their
 election, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

3 B. At the general election to be held in November 1974, and 4 each four (4) years thereafter for county treasurers and until 5 November 2018 for county assessors, there shall be elected in each county of the state, a county assessor and a county treasurer, who 6 7 shall hold office for a term of four (4) years. The term of the county assessor shall begin on the first business day in January 8 9 following the election, and shall terminate when a successor is 10 elected and qualified. The term of the county treasurer shall begin 11 on the first Monday in July following the election and shall 12 terminate when the successor is duly elected and qualified. At the 13 general election to be held in November 2018, and each four (4) 14 years thereafter, there shall be elected in each assessor district 15 of the state, as provided by subsection A of Section 1 of this act, 16 a district assessor who shall hold office for a term of four (4) 17 years. The term of the district assessor shall begin on the first 18 business day in January following the election and shall terminate 19 when a successor is elected and qualified.

20 C. At the general election to be held in November 1990, and 21 each four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected in each 22 county of the state two county commissioners, one from the first 23 county commissioner district and one from the third county 24 commissioner district, who shall hold office for a term of four (4)

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1 years. At the general election to be held in November 1990, there shall be elected in each county of the state one county commissioner 2 3 from the second county commissioner district who shall hold office 4 for a term of six (6) years. At the general election to be held in 5 November 1996, and each four (4) years thereafter, there shall be elected in each county of the state, one county commissioner from 6 7 the second county commissioner district, who shall hold office for a term of four (4) years. The terms of the county commissioners shall 8 9 begin on the first business day in January following their election, 10 and shall terminate when their successors are elected and qualified.

D. A county officer shall be eligible to become a candidate for
another county office or state office.

E. In order to file as a candidate for county commissioner in a county commissioner's district, the candidate must have been a qualified registered elector and have maintained a current principal residence in that district for at least six (6) months immediately preceding the first day of the filing period prescribed by law. Evidence of a "principal residence" may include, but not be limited to, the address listed on:

20 1. A federal or state tax return;

21 2. A driver license; or

22 3. An automobile registration.

23SECTION 3.AMENDATORY26 O.S. 2011, Section 5-110, is24amended to read as follows:

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1	Section 5-110. A. Except as otherwise provided in this
2	section, Declarations of Candidacy provided herein must be filed
3	with the secretary of the appropriate election board no earlier than
4	8:00 a.m. on the second Wednesday of April of any even-numbered year
5	and no later than 5:00 p.m. on the next succeeding Friday. Such
6	Declarations of Candidacy may be transmitted by United States mail,
7	but in no event shall the secretary of any election board accept
8	such Declarations after the time prescribed by law.
9	B. Declarations of Candidacy for district assessors for the
10	November 2018 election shall be filed with the Oklahoma State
11	Election Board no earlier than 8:00 a.m. on July 2, 2018, and no
12	later than 5:00 p.m. on July 13, 2018. Such Declarations of
13	Candidacy may be transmitted by United States mail.
14	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
15	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
16	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
17	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
