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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 51.2e of Title 74, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. Each agency, board, commission, department or other state
17	governmental entity organized within the executive department shall
18	develop a contingency plan for the effects of an electromagnetic
19	pulse, whether a naturally occurring event or used as a weapon of
20	terrorism.
21	B. The contingency plan shall include, but not be limited to
22	the following:
23	1. Methods to maintain essential services performed by the

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state governmental entity to the extent practical;

- 2. Plans for communication to persons, firms or other legal entities that utilize the services of the state governmental entity regarding the impact of an electromagnetic pulse on operations and a time frame within which services can be expected to be restored;
- 3. Methods to communicate with federal, state and local law enforcement authorities, including authorities responsible for responding to acts of foreign or domestic terrorism;
- 4. Methods to safeguard, to the extent possible, communications systems, computer hardware, tangible or intangible personal property used to support or facilitate communications systems or computer systems used by the state governmental entity;
- 5. Methods to mitigate, to the extent practical, the loss of essential services performed by the state governmental entity; and
- 6. Such other methods or plans as the chief executive officer or the governing board of the state governmental entity determines to be necessary.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
