6 An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021,
7 Section 1210.229-1, which relates to the Oklahoma
8 Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Life Skills
9 Education Act; expanding applicability of act;
10 requiring certain instruction on fentanyl abuse
11 prevention and drug poisoning awareness; prescribing
12 frequency of and grades for instruction; listing
13 information to be included in fentanyl abuse
14 instruction; authorizing organizations and persons to
15 provide instruction; directing Governor to designate
16 Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Week in schools;
17 providing for certain instruction during designated
18 week; providing for codification; providing an
19 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.229-1,
22 is amended to read as follows:

23 Section 1210.229-1 Sections 1210.229-1 through 1210.229-5 of
24 this title and Section 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited
as the "Oklahoma Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Life Skills
Education Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.229-8 of Title 70, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. As part of the comprehensive integrated curriculum for
2 substance abuse programs provided in Section 1210.229-5 of Title 70
3 of the Oklahoma Statutes, each school district shall annually
4 provide research-based instruction related to fentanyl abuse
5 prevention and drug poisoning awareness to students in grades six
6 through twelve.

7 B. The instruction required by this section shall include:

8 1. Suicide prevention;

9 2. Prevention of the abuse of and addiction to fentanyl;

10 3. Awareness of local school and community resources and how to
11 access those resources; and

12 4. Health education that includes information about substance
13 use and abuse of fentanyl, including youth substance use and abuse
14 of fentanyl.

15 C. The instruction required by this section may be provided by
16 an organization or an employee or agent of an organization that is:

17 1. A public or private institution of higher education;

18 2. A library;

19 3. A community service organization;

20 4. A religious organization;

21 5. A local public health agency; or

22 6. An organization employing mental health professionals.

23 D. To educate students about the dangers posed by fentanyl and
24 the risks of fentanyl poisoning, including overdose, the Governor
