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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-317, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-317. A. A death certificate for each death which
20	occurs in this state shall be filed with the State Department of
21	Health, within three (3) days after such death.
22	B. The funeral director shall personally sign the death
23	certificate and shall be responsible for filing the death
24	certificate. If the funeral director is not available, the person

1 acting as such who first assumes custody of a dead body in accordance with Section 1158 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes 2 3 shall personally sign and file the death certificate. The personal 4 data shall be obtained from the next of kin or the best qualified 5 person or source available. The certificate shall be completed as 6 to personal data and delivered to the attending physician or the 7 medical examiner responsible for completing the medical certification portion of the certificate of death within twenty-four 8 9 (24) hours after the death. No later than July 1, 2012, the 10 personal data, and no later than July 1, 2017, the medical 11 certificate portion, shall be entered into the prescribed electronic 12 system provided by the State Registrar of Vital Statistics and the 13 information submitted to the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. 14 The resultant certificate produced by the electronic system shall be 15 provided to the physician or medical examiner for medical 16 certification within twenty-four (24) hours after the death. 17 С. The medical certification shall be completed and signed 18 within forty-eight (48) hours after death by the physician or 19 advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant in charge 20 of the patient's care for the illness or condition which resulted in 21 death, except when inquiry as to the cause of death is required by 22 Section 938 of this title. No later than July 1, 2017, the medical 23 certification portion of certificate data shall be entered into the

24 prescribed electronic system provided by the State Registrar of

Vital Statistics and the information submitted to the State
Registrar of Vital Statistics.

D. In the event that the physician or advanced practice registered nurse <u>or physician assistant</u> in charge of the patient's care for the illness or condition which resulted in death is not in attendance at the time of death, the medical certification shall be completed and signed within forty-eight (48) hours after death by the physician or advanced practice registered nurse <u>or physician</u> assistant in attendance at the time of death, except:

When the patient is under hospice care at the time of death,
the medical certification may be signed by the hospice's medical
director; and

When inquiry as to the cause of death is required by Section
938 of this title.

Provided, that such certification, if signed by other than the attending physician or advanced practice registered nurse <u>or</u> <u>physician assistant</u>, shall note on the face the name of the attending physician, <u>physician assistant</u>, or advanced practice registered nurse and that the information shown is only as reported. E. A certifier completing cause of death on a certificate of death who knows that a lethal drug, overdose or other means of
