6 An Act relating to the Grand River Dam Authority;
7 amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, which relates
8 to Grand River Dam Authority exemptions; providing
9 for certain Oklahoma Open Records Act exemptions; and
10 providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 862.1 In addition to the powers, rights and privileges
15 enumerated in Section 862 of this title, the Grand River Dam
16 Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of ~~the~~:

17 1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, exclusively limited to:

18 a. customer proprietary information the Authority is
19 contractually obligated to keep confidential, and

20 b. security plans and procedures in its role as an
21 electric utility regulated by the federal government,

22 c. information related to the security of electrical or
23 dam infrastructure and related information systems

24 that, if misused, could facilitate actual, potential,

1 or threatened interference with, attack on, compromise
2 of, or incapacitation of such infrastructure or
3 information systems, including information related to
4 the ability of such infrastructure or information
5 systems to resist such interference, compromise, or
6 incapacitation, including any planned or past
7 assessment, projection, or estimate of the
8 vulnerability of critical infrastructure or
9 information system, security testing, risk evaluation
10 thereto, risk management planning, operational plans,
11 structural schematics, recovery of response plans or
12 risk audits, and

13 d. proprietary or commercial information received subject
14 to a nondisclosure agreement or confidentiality
15 agreement;

16 2. The Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, exclusively limited to
17 authorizing the Grand River Dam Authority Board of Directors to
18 confer on:

- 19 a. coal or gas fuel supply and transportation contracts,
- 20 b. power purchase agreements, and
- 21 c. security plans and procedures in its role as an
22 electric utility regulated by the federal government;
23 and

24 3. Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

1 4. The Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination
2 Act;

3 5. The State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

4 6. The Surplus Property Act; provided that the district may, on
5 a transactional basis, elect to make itself subject to the
6 requirements of the Surplus Property Act.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
