NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2501 of Title 70, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 There is hereby created the Oklahoma University-Trained 23 Teacher Retention Program, which shall be administered by the

Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

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- B. Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, the program, depending upon and limited to the balance of the Oklahoma

 University-Trained Teacher Retention Program Revolving Fund established pursuant to subsection G of this section, shall provide retention stipends to applicants who meet the requirements in subsection D of this section as approved by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.
- C. Stipends shall be distributed to participants by drafts made payable to participants. Prior to any disbursement, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall certify and properly review applications submitted by applicants and determine eligibility in accordance with subsection D of this section.
- D. An applicant shall be eligible to participate in the retention program if the applicant has:
- 1. Graduated after the effective date of this act from an accredited or approved teacher education program at an institution of higher education in this state; and
- 2. Been employed for no less than five (5) school years as a classroom teacher at a Title I school in this state. As used in this paragraph, "Title I school" means a public school that receives funds pursuant to the Every Student Succeeds Act, 20 U.S.C., Section 6301 et seq., and is obligated to comply with the provisions of that federal law.

E. The amount of the retention stipend for a single participant shall not exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) per five-year period of employment. A participant may resubmit additional applications for a retention stipend and receive a stipend, provided that:

- 1. No year of employment shall be claimed by a participant on more than one application;
- 2. Additional applications shall cover five-year increments of employment;
- 3. The cumulative retention stipends awarded pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma University-Trained Teacher Retention Program shall not exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for any single participant; and
- 4. No stipend shall be awarded to a participant making a claim based on a year of employment for which the participant is eligible to receive or has received funds through the Teacher Shortage Employment Incentive Program administered by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.
- F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may accept donations of public or private funds to assist in funding the Oklahoma University-Trained Teacher Retention Program. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may contract with other public entities and nonprofit organizations for the endowment, management, and administration of such funds.

G. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to be designated the "Oklahoma University-Trained Teacher Retention Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education from public and private sources. All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for the purpose of providing teacher retention stipends through the Oklahoma University-Trained Teacher Retention Program. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
