9	An Act relating to transportation; requiring
10	installation of pipe that meets certain standards; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-1302, which relates
11	to maintenance and construction zones; requiring certain installation and maintenance of business
12	access signs; requiring certain placement; requiring installation at commencement of construction;
13	requiring certain inspection; and providing an effective date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1914 of Title 69, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	All pipe used by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation or
21	the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority for underground water, drainage, and
22	sewer shall be installed to the National Standards for which the
23	National Standard for Polypropylene is ASTM D2321 and the National
24	Standard for Concrete Pipe is ASTM C1479.

1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-1302, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 11-1302. A. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation, 3 4 Oklahoma Turnpike Authority and any county or city in this state are 5 hereby authorized to close any highway or section thereof, within 6 their respective jurisdiction, to traffic while the highway is 7 flooded or under repair, maintenance or construction and, in 8 exercising the authority, shall erect or cause to be erected 9 traffic-control devices and barricades to warn and notify the public 10 that the highway has been closed to traffic.

11 When any highway has been closed to traffic under the Β. 12 provisions of subsection A of this section and traffic-control 13 devices or barricades have been erected, it shall be unlawful for 14 any person to drive any vehicle through, under, over, or around the 15 traffic-control devices or barricades, or otherwise to enter the 16 closed area. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to 17 persons while engaged in the construction, maintenance and repair of 18 the highway or to persons entering therein for the protection of 19 lives or property; provided, that persons having their places of 20 residence or places of business within the closed area may travel, 21 when possible to do so, through the area at their own risk.

C. <u>1.</u> Whenever construction, repair and maintenance of any
highway is being performed under traffic, the Oklahoma Turnpike
Authority, Department of Transportation, county or city having

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1 jurisdiction over the highway shall erect, or cause to be erected, 2 traffic-control devices to warn and guide the public. Each person using the highway shall obey all signs, signals, markings, flagmen 3 4 or other traffic-control devices which are placed to regulate, 5 control, and quide traffic through the construction or maintenance area. As used in this subsection, "construction or maintenance 6 7 area" means any area upon or around any highway that is visibly 8 marked as an area where construction, repair, and maintenance is 9 temporarily occurring. The construction or maintenance area also 10 includes the lanes of highway leading up to the area upon which an 11 activity described in this section is being performed, beginning at 12 the point where properly posted traffic-control devices start to 13 warn and quide the public into and through the construction or 14 maintenance including, but not limited to, instructions to merge 15 from one lane into another lane, to reduce speed, or to follow 16 directions of flagmen.

17 Whenever construction, repair, and maintenance of any 2. 18 highway is being performed under traffic, the Oklahoma Turnpike 19 Authority, Department of Transportation, county, or city having 20 jurisdiction over the highway shall, during the planning and 21 execution of construction projects that obstruct or limit access to 22 businesses, install and maintain clear and conspicuous business 23 access signs. Business access signs shall be strategically placed 24 to inform the public of the continued availability of access to

1 affected businesses. The signs shall be visible from the roadway 2 and designed to minimize confusion for motorists and pedestrians. Business access signs shall be installed in advance of the 3 4 commencement of construction activities that may impact access to 5 businesses. In cases where construction activities are ongoing for 6 an extended period, the Department of Transportation shall regularly 7 inspect and, if necessary, update business access signs to ensure 8 accuracy and relevance.

9 D. The "Merge Now" traffic-control device that is used to warn 10 and guide the public using the highway to merge shall be located in advance of the highway construction or maintenance area in 11 12 accordance with the standards set forth in the most current edition 13 of the Federal Highway Administration's Manual on Uniform Traffic 14 Control Devices. Whenever any traffic-control device requires 15 traffic to merge due to the closure of a section or lane of highway, 16 the merge shall be completed:

As soon as practicable after passing the traffic-control
 device; and

Without passing any other traffic proceeding in the same
 direction.

E. No person shall remove, change, modify, deface or alter any traffic-control device or barricade which has been erected on any highway under the provisions of this section.

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F. Nothing in this section shall relieve the state or any of
 its subdivisions or their contractors, agents, servants or employees
 from liability for failure to perform any of the duties imposed
 herein.

5 G. Except as provided in subsection H of this section, any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon 6 7 conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not 8 less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand 9 Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 10 thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment, and shall be 11 liable for any damage to property, or injury to or death to persons 12 caused by the violations. In addition, the court may order 13 restitution in an amount equal to the actual costs of the emergency 14 response and repair or replacement of any damaged or lost emergency 15 equipment.

16 When any section of a highway, turnpike, county road or city Η. 17 street has been closed to traffic due to flooding that is ongoing 18 and traffic-control devices or barricades have been erected by law 19 enforcement or other government officials with authority over 20 traffic control, it shall be unlawful for any person to tear down, 21 damage or remove any traffic-control devices or barricades or drive 22 any vehicle through, under, over or around the traffic-control 23 devices or barricades, or otherwise to enter the closed area. Any 24 person who violates the provisions of this subsection shall, upon

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1 conviction, be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not 2 less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). The person shall be quilty of a misdemeanor 3 4 punishable by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) 5 nor more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) and 6 imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year if 7 the operator of the motor vehicle was transporting a person eighteen 8 (18) years of age or younger at the time of the violation.

9 Persons convicted pursuant to the provisions of this subsection 10 shall be ordered to pay restitution in an amount equal to the actual 11 costs of the emergency response and repair or replacement of any 12 damaged or lost emergency equipment. In addition, the person shall 13 be liable for any damage to property or injury or death to persons 14 caused by the violation.

15 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
