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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-186, as
15	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2019 (70 O.S. Supp.
16	2019, Section 6-186), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 6-186. A. Criteria for the approval and accreditation
18	of teacher education programs in Oklahoma institutions of higher
19	education shall include, but not be limited to, substantial evidence
20	that persons who enter teacher education programs demonstrate:
21	1. Competency in the oral and written use of the English
22	language;
23	2. A minimum grade point average as established by the
24	Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability; and

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3. The ability to meet criteria established pursuant to the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act at the completion of the teacher
education program and provide evidence of having worked with
children or youth in a variety of situations.

5 Criteria shall also include a greater emphasis upon field work 6 in accredited schools by prospective teachers under the supervision 7 of higher education faculty.

The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability 8 Β. 9 shall work with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and 10 the various institutions of higher education in developing 11 guidelines for a paid teacher internship program which may be 12 offered at each institution for prospective teachers. The purpose 13 of each program shall be to provide mentorship and support for 14 prospective teachers. Students enrolled in a teacher education 15 program shall be eligible to participate in the program. Only 16 students who have completed the minimum teacher internship 17 requirement as established by the institution shall be eligible to 18 participate in the paid teacher internship program. Each eligible 19 student participating in the teacher internship program shall be 20 awarded a one-time stipend of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00). 21 С. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Legislature 22 that the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability work

with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the various

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1 full-time teacher education faculty continue their professional development during their tenure at an institution of higher 2 education to ensure that the future teachers of this state are 3 4 taught by professional educators fully trained in their area of 5 expertise. Each approved or accredited program of teacher education shall have a system for documenting and reporting the annual 6 7 professional development activities of all teacher education faculty members. Faculty professional development reports shall be reviewed 8 9 by the Commission along with professional development activities as 10 a normal part of the accreditation process.

It is further declared to be the intent of the Legislature that such professional development plans provide alternative means of education including, but not limited to:

14 1. Professional development programs;

15 2. Higher education courses;

Exchange programs with public school classroom teachers,
administrators, and other school personnel; and

4. Programs whereby all full-time teacher education faculty members directly involved in the teacher education process, including all administrators of the teacher education program, are required to serve in a state accredited public school for at least ten (10) clock hours per school year in responsibilities related to their respective teacher education teaching fields.

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All public school systems shall participate in the programs
provided for in this subsection when needed.

D. The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall adopt rules requiring specific improvements to strengthen the screening of student applicants and field activity and placement as set out in subsection A of this section. Such rules shall be reviewed and amended or readopted by the Commission at least once every five (5) years.

9 Ε. To assist the Commission in setting specific requirements as 10 set out in subsections A and D of this section, the Commission shall 11 annually prepare a statistical report showing the percentage of 12 students from each of the Oklahoma institutions of higher education 13 who have successfully completed or who have failed the competency 14 examination for certification. The annual report shall show the 15 percentages for each institution of higher education and each 16 assessment area separately by student degree status and shall be 17 distributed annually to each member of the Commission for 18 Educational Quality and Accountability, the Oklahoma State Regents 19 for Higher Education, the governing board of each institution which 20 has an approved or state accredited teacher education program, the 21 State Board of Education, the State Board of Career and Technology 22 Education and the Legislature.

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1	F. By November 1, 2017, the Commission shall adopt rules
2	requiring coursework or training in the use of digital and other
3	instructional technologies as a requisite for program accreditation.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
