7	An Act relating to public safety; creating the
8	Oklahoma Disaster Resilience Act; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 683.6, which relates to hazard
9	mitigation; creating the Interagency Resilience Coordination Council; directing the Oklahoma
10	Department of Emergency Management lead council; directing each agency director designate a resilience
11	officer; directing each presiding officer of the Legislature designate a resilience officer; directing
12	the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court designate a resilience officer; directing resilience
13	officers coordinate with Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and serve on Interagency
14	Resilience Coordination Council; establishing council; providing details of meetings of council;
15	directing council to make recommendations and render assistance; directing Department of Emergency
16	Management to serve a lead resilience office; defining resilience; directing the Department of
17	Emergency Management to carry out certain duties; directing the Department of Emergency Management to
18	develop a strategic statewide resilience report; providing required information; directing for report
19	to be updated; directing report be submitted by certain date annually; establishing the Oklahoma
20	Resilience Task Force; directing that the task force be composed of certain members; directing for
21	meetings; directing that the Department of Emergency Management submit initial statewide resilience
22	report; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
2	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.1 of Title 63, unless there
4	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
5	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
6	Natural Disaster Protection and Preparedness Act".
7	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 683.6, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	Section 683.6 A. There is hereby created the State Hazard
10	Mitigation Team Interagency Resilience Coordination Council,
11	composed of the administrative heads of the following agencies or
12	their designees and led by the Oklahoma Department of Emergency
13	Management:
14	1. Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, who shall serve
15	as the Team Coordinator;
16	2. Oklahoma Water Resources Board;
17	3. Oklahoma Climatological Survey;
18	4. Oklahoma Conservation Commission;
19	5. Corporation Commission;
20	6. Oklahoma Department of Commerce;
21	7. Department of Environmental Quality;
22	8. Department of Human Services;
23	9. State Department of Health;
24	10. Department of Transportation;

1	11. Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry or
2	the Secretary of Agriculture;
3	12. Department of Wildlife Conservation;
4	13. Oklahoma Historical Society;
5	14. Oklahoma Insurance Department;
6	15. Association of County Commissioners of Oklahoma;
7	16. Oklahoma Municipal League;
8	17. State Fire Marshal;
9	18. Department of Labor;
10	19. A local Emergency Management Director as determined by the
11	President of the Oklahoma Emergency Management Association;
12	20. State Chancellor or his or her representative for The
13	Oklahoma State System of Higher Education; and
14	21. State Director or his or her representative for the
15	Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education
16	1. Each agency director in the executive branch of state
17	government shall designate at least one person to serve as the
18	agency's resilience officer and shall transmit the name and contact
19	information of each designee to the Oklahoma Department of Emergency
20	Management and shall notify the Oklahoma Department of Emergency
21	Management of any change in the name or contact information of a
22	designee within ten (10) days;
23	2. Each presiding officer of the Legislature shall designate at
24	least one person to serve as the Legislature's resilience officer

1	and shall transmit the name and contact information of each designee
2	to the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and shall notify
3	Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management of any change in the
4	name or contact information of a designee within ten (10) days;
5	3. The Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall
6	designate at least one person to serve as the judiciary's resilience
7	officer and shall transmit the name and contact information of each
8	designee to the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and
9	shall notify the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management of any
10	change in the name or contact information of a designee within ten
11	(10) days;
12	4. The agency resilience officers shall coordinate activities
13	with the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management as necessary
14	and shall serve on the Interagency Resilience Coordination Council
15	as provided in this section of this act.
16	B. Depending on the circumstances, the Team Coordinator may
17	request participation of the heads of any other state agencies as
18	deemed appropriate.
19	C. The Team Coordinator shall also request that a
20	representative of the United States Army Corps of Engineers be
21	appointed by the administrative head of the Tulsa District to
22	participate on the Team.
23	D. The Team Coordinator shall also request a representative of
24	the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development be appointed by

¹ the administrative head of the Oklahoma City office to participate
² on the team.

3	E. The State Hazard Mitigation Team will meet as determined by
4	the Team Coordinator to review and recommend updates to the State
5	Comprehensive All-hazard Mitigation Plan, and shall have those
6	additional responsibilities as provided by the Team Coordinator,
7	including, but not limited to, the review and recommendation for
8	loan and grant application under the Oklahoma Flood Hazard
9	Mitigation Program.
10	B. The Interagency Resilience Coordination Council is
11	established to maintain awareness, communication, and alignment with
12	regard to the state's resilience and risk mitigation needs,
13	progress, and priorities, and to oversee development of the
14	statewide resilience report.
15	C. The council shall be comprised of the resilience officers
16	from each state agency. The Oklahoma Department of Emergency
17	Management shall serve as the chair.
18	D. The council shall meet upon the call of the chair, with a
19	minimum of four meetings annually.
20	E. The council shall make recommendations to and render
21	assistance and guidance to agencies in the development of strategic
22	plans for resilience.
23	F. The council will meet annually to:
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1 <u>1. Review and recommend updates to state mitigation and</u> 2 resilience planning efforts;

3 2. Provide support and assistance in the preparation and 4 maintenance of the State Hazard Mitigation Plan as required by the 5 federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, U.S.C 5121, et seq., which 6 requires all states to adopt and maintain a FEMA-approved State 7 Hazard Mitigation Plan as a prerequisite for receiving federal 8 disaster assistance under the Stafford Act; provide, however, the 9 Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall be responsible for 10 day to day execution of the Plan. 11 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.2 of Title 63, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14

A. This act hereby instructs the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management to serve as the lead resilience office for the state and to perform the functions and duties provided in this act.

B. For purposes of this act, the term "resilience" shall mean a capability to anticipate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from significant multi-hazard threats with minimal damage to social wellbeing, the economy, infrastructure, and the environment.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall:

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1 1. Coordinate and provide strategic direction for government 2 resilience initiatives in order to build long-term resilience for a 3 robust, vibrant economic activity and a sustainable natural 4 environment for Oklahoma residents;

2. Designate a resilience officer within the agency;

Brovide technical guidance to agencies, as well as local and
 regional jurisdictions, to integrate statewide resilience goals into
 future projects, plans, and programs;

9 4. Review and reconcile state agency comments on federally 10 sponsored resilience and risk mitigation activities to establish and 11 present an official state position;

12 5. Pursue all available federal and private funds consistent 13 with the purposes of this act; and

14 6. Appraise the adequacy of statutory and administrative 15 mechanisms for coordinating the state's policies and programs at 16 both the intrastate and interstate levels with respect to resilience 17 and risk mitigation;

18 7. Appraise the adequacy of federal, regional, state, and local 19 programs to achieve the policies and meet the goals of the state 20 with respect to resilience and risk mitigation;

21 8. Coordinate and focus federal involvement in Oklahoma with 22 respect to resilience and risk mitigation;

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9. Provide official state recommendations to the Legislature
 and United States Congress with respect to policies, programs, and
 coordinating mechanisms relative to resilience and risk mitigation;

4 10. Assist with the state's planning efforts to ensure the
5 incorporation and alignment of the state's resilience goals and
6 objectives into a unified, proactive, pre-disaster approach to
7 adaptation and long-term resilience; and

8 11. Represent the resilience and risk mitigation policy of the
9 state at the federal, regional, state, and local levels.

10 12. Integrate resilience into pre-disaster planning and post-11 disaster recovery.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.4 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. To coordinate and strengthen efforts to reduce losses from future disasters across the state, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall contribute to all statewide planning efforts related to resilience and risk mitigation and shall develop a strategic statewide resilience report to protect the state from multiple threats. The report shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Articulation of the state's resilience goals and objectives;
Utilization of best available science, including a range of
future projections, to identify and implement policies, projects,

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1 and programs that achieve the state's resilience goals and 2 objectives;

3 3. Prioritization of agency-identified adaptation actions based
 4 on a vulnerability assessment of risks to agency mission areas,
 5 assets, services, and populations served from multiple environmental
 6 threats; and

4. Descriptions of agency strategic actions;

8 5. Progress on activities identified in the State Hazard
 9 Mitigation Plan.

B. The statewide resilience report shall be updated every year with the latest available science and updated conditions.

12 C. The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall submit 13 the annual statewide resilience report to the Legislature by 14 November 15 every year.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby established the Oklahoma Resilience Task
 Force to provide strategic direction to resilience efforts across
 the state.

B. The task force shall be composed of the following members:

1. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, who shall serve as chair and shall represent the views of the Interagency Resilience Coordination Council;

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The Insurance Commissioner or their designee; 2 The Secretary of the Department of Transportation or their 3. 3 designee; 4 4. The Chair of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission or their 5 designee; 6 5. The President of the Association of County Commissioners of 7 Oklahoma or their designee; 8 6. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Municipal League or 9 their designee; 10 7. The Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives or 11 their designee; 12 The President pro-tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate or 8. 13 their designee; 14 9. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 15 Education or their designee; and 16 10. The Chair may appoint additional membership from state, 17 local, tribal governments, the private sector, non-governmental 18 organizations, and advisors from Federal agencies to serve on the 19 task force and shall incorporate State, local, and tribal government 20 and private sector input in the development and revision of the 21 State Hazard Mitigation Plan and other related plans and strategies. 22 С. The Task Force shall meet quarterly and at the call of the 23 chair.

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1	SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 696.6 of Title 63, unless there
3	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
4	The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall submit the
5	initial statewide resilience report to the Legislature by October 1,
6	2025, and the chief resilience officer shall convene the first
7	meeting of the Interagency Resilience Coordination Council no later
8	than October 1, 2024.
9	SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
10	SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
