NEW LAW 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 903 of Title 15, unless there is 19 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma 21 Electronics Owner Right to Repair Act". 22 SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 904 of Title 15, unless there is 24 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Legislature finds and declares that:

1. The ability to diagnose, service and repair an electronic device in a timely, reliable and affordable manner is essential to the safety and well-being of consumers in this state;

- 2. Consumers are entitled to choose among competing repair facilities for the convenient, reliable and affordable repair of their electronics;
- 3. Increased competition among repair facilities will benefit electronics owners in this state;
- 4. The diagnosis, service and repair of these electronics are essential to their safe and proper operation;
- 5. In many instances, businesses or manufacturers of electronics prevent owners from making, or having another person make, the necessary diagnosis, service and repair of their electronics in a timely, convenient, reliable and affordable manner;
 - 6. Electronics owners in this state should have the right:
 - a. to obtain all information necessary to provide for the diagnosis, service and repair of their electronics,
 - b. to choose between original parts and aftermarket parts when repairing their electronics, and
 - c. to make, or have another person make, repairs necessary to keep their electronics in reasonably good and serviceable condition during the expected life span of the electronics; and

7. The lack of access to electronic repair information regarding who can repair electronics and what parts may be used to repair those electronics limit consumer choice and thus limits competition.

A new section of law to be codified SECTION 3. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 905 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in Oklahoma Electronics Owner Right to Repair Act:

- "Consumer Protection Unit" means the Consumer Protection 1. Unit within the Office of the Attorney General;
- "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business of manufacturing, assembling or distributing electronics who will, under normal business conditions during the year, manufacture, assemble or distribute to dealers at least fifty new electronic devices:
- "Electronic device" or "electronics" means electronic equipment, or a part of electronic equipment, originally manufactured for distribution and sale in the United States;
 - "Electronic equipment" means:
 - a. any system, part, or component of an electronic device as originally manufactured, or
 - b. any similar part or component manufactured or sold for replacement or improvement of a system, part or

component or as an accessory or addition to an electronic device;

- 5. "Repair facility" means a person engaged in the repair, diagnosing or servicing of electronics or electronic devices; and
- 6. "Electronics owner" means any person who owns, leases or otherwise has the legal right to use and possess an electronic device or the agent of such person.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 906 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Upon request, the manufacturer of an electronic device shall promptly provide to the owner, to a repair facility, and to the Consumer Protection Unit for use by any electronics owner or repair facility, the information necessary to diagnose, service or repair an electronic device. The information shall include:
- 1. Information necessary to integrate replacement equipment into the electronic device; and
- 2. Other information, as determined by the Consumer Protection Unit, that is used to diagnose, service, repair, activate, certify or install any electronic equipment in an electronic device.
- B. A manufacturer shall not be required to publicly disclose information that, if made public, would divulge methods or processes entitled to protection as trade secrets of that manufacturer, but may be required to disclose that information to the Consumer

Protection Unit for the purpose of determining whether that information is entitled to such protection. The determination shall be made on the record after an opportunity for an agency hearing.

No information may be withheld by a manufacturer if that information is provided either directly or indirectly to franchised dealers or other repair dealers.

- C. The Consumer Protection Unit shall prescribe rules setting forth the uniform method by which a manufacturer shall provide the information required by subsection A of this section, including disclosure in writing, on the Internet, or in any other manner, or under the terms the Consumer Protection Unit determines may be appropriate.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 907 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Any person who violates any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Electronics Owner Right to Repair Act, in addition to any other penalty provided by law, may be fined in an amount not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a first offense and not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for any second or subsequent offense.
- B. An electronics owner or repair facility may bring a civil action to enjoin a violation of this act and to recover the costs of litigation including reasonable attorney and expert witness fees.
