A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-131 of Title 2, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Urban 19 and Innovative Agriculture Advancement Act". 20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-132 of Title 2, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 24

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for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission to be designated the

"Oklahoma Urban and Innovative Agriculture Advancement Act Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Oklahoma Conservation Commission from state-appropriated funds, federal funds, donations, grants, and contributions from any public or private source and designated for the purpose set forth in this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Conservation Commission for the purpose of administering the Urban Gardens Grant Act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-133 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall establish and administer a grant program to support urban farming, community gardens, and innovative agriculture projects in urban and suburban areas.
- B. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall promulgate rules and adopt eligibility guidelines necessary to enforce and administer the Oklahoma Urban and Innovative Agriculture Advancement Act, including an application process for grants. The applicants must

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demonstrate a plan for sustainable urban agriculture practices and community engagement in order to receive a grant. Priority will be given to projects that involve educational components and benefit underserved communities.

- C. Grants may be used for the following:
- 1. Equipment;

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- 2. Supplies;
- 3. Training;
- 4. Educational outreach; and
- 5. Research in sustainable agriculture methods.
- D. Grant recipients must submit annual progress reports to the Oklahoma Conservation Commission.
- E. Entities eligible to apply for the grants are nonprofit organizations, educational institutions, and local government entities in Oklahoma.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-134 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The expenditures from the Oklahoma Urban and Innovative

Agriculture Advancement Act Revolving Fund and other expenditures

governed by this act, if made in accordance with the requirements of

this act, shall be construed as an expenditure of public funds in

furtherance of governmental functions and for the purpose of

conferring general and uniform benefits resulting from the

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    expenditures upon the residents and other legal entities located in
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    areas subject to the jurisdiction of the entities described in
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    Section 2 of this act.
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        SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
