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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-160 of Title 43A, unless there
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	There is hereby established within the Oklahoma Department of
23	Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services the "Office of Faith-
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1 based and Community Initiatives", hereafter referred to as the 2 "Office".

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-161 of Title 43A, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 In order to maximize the effectiveness of state government 7 through collaboration with faith-based and community initiatives to 8 serve Oklahomans with respect to public purposes, such as improving 9 public safety, overcoming addiction, strengthening families and 10 communities, and overcoming poverty, the Office shall, to the extent 11 permitted by law:

Promote and foster the development of relationships and
 coordination between state government and faith-based and community
 initiatives and serve as a resource for and liaison between state
 government and such initiatives;

16 2. Coordinate activities designed to mobilize public support 17 for faith-based and community initiatives through volunteerism, 18 special projects, and public-private partnerships;

19 3. Ensure that state government decisions and programs are 20 consistent with the goal of partnering with faith-based and 21 community initiatives when doing so is in the public interest, and 22 monitor how such decisions and programs affect faith-based and 23 community initiatives;

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4. Work with state, local, and community policymakers,
 volunteers, and public officials to facilitate coordination with and
 empowerment of faith-based and other community organizations, where
 doing so, would improve such groups' service to the communities
 involved; and

5. Showcase and herald successful and innovative faith-based7 and community organizations and civic initiatives.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-162 of Title 43A, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
Services shall carry out the training, engagement, and
implementation of the Office of Faith-based and Community
Initiatives.

B. The Office may enter into such contractual and promotional
agreements necessary to maximize the effectiveness of state
government through collaboration with faith-based and community
initiatives to serve Oklahomans with respect to public purposes.

C. The Office may work with local governments, private organizations, and citizens as it plans and engages in activities related to the Office.

22 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-163 of Title 43A, unless there 24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1	The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
2	Services shall annually submit to the Governor, the President Pro
3	Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker of the
4	Oklahoma House of Representatives, within ninety (90) days after the
5	end of its fiscal year, a report setting forth its operation and
6	accomplishments of the Office of Faith-based and Community
7	Initiatives.
8	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
