7 An Act relating to state government; creating the
8 Pre-trial Data Collection Act; requiring certain
9 entities to collect specific data; providing certain
10 reporting requirements to the Office of Management
11 and Enterprise Services; providing for publication of
12 certain datasets; requiring certain public format;
13 specifying certain submission dates; providing for
14 certain publication date; providing certain action
15 for noncompliance; providing for codification; and
16 providing an effective date.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 81.2 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Pre-trial
Data Collection Act".

B. Beginning January 1, 2023, an entity required to collect
data in accordance with this section shall collect the specified
data required of the entity on a monthly basis. Each entity shall
report the data collected in accordance with this subsection to the
Office of Management and Enterprise Services on a monthly basis.

1 C. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
2 publish datasets in its possession in a modern, open, electronic
3 format that is machine-readable and readily accessible by the public
4 on the website of the agency. The published data shall be
5 searchable, at a minimum, by each data element, county, circuit, and
6 unique identifier. Agencies that employ five hundred (500) or more
7 employees shall submit data by July 1, 2023. Agencies that employ
8 more than one hundred (100) but less than five hundred (500)
9 employees shall submit data by December 31, 2023. Agencies with
10 more than zero (0) and less than one hundred (100) employees shall
11 submit data by July 1, 2024. Beginning January 1, 2023, the Office
12 of Management and Enterprise Services shall begin publishing the
13 data received in the same modern, open, electronic format that is
14 machine-readable and readily accessible to the public on the website
15 of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

16 D. Upon a determination by the Office of Management and
17 Enterprise Services of noncompliance, any member of any board of
18 county commissioners may bring an action in a district court having
19 jurisdiction over the county from which the county commissioner
20 serves to force compliance. If any entity covered under the
21 provision of this act encompasses more than one county, upon a
22 determination by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services of
23 noncompliance, a county commissioner serving from any of the
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1 entity's encompassed counties may bring such action against the
2 entity.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
