11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 6, State Question No. 788,
13 Initiative Petition No. 412, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 509,
14 O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 425), is amended to read as
15 follows:

16 Section 425. A. No school or landlord may refuse to enroll or
17 lease to and may not otherwise penalize a person solely for his or
18 her status as a medical marijuana license holder, unless failing to
19 do so would cause the school or landlord the potential to lose a
20 monetary or licensing-related benefit under federal law or
21 regulations.

22 B. Unless a failure to do so would cause an employer the
23 potential to lose a monetary or licensing-related benefit under
24 federal law or regulations, an employer may not discriminate against

1 a person in hiring, termination or imposing any term or condition of
2 employment or otherwise penalize a person based upon either:

3 1. The status of the person as a medical marijuana license
4 holder; or

5 2. Employers may take action against a holder of a medical
6 marijuana license if the holder uses or possesses marijuana while in
7 his or her place of employment or during the hours of employment.

8 Employers may not take action against the holder of a medical
9 marijuana license solely based upon the status of an employee as a
10 medical marijuana license holder or the results of a drug test
11 showing positive for marijuana or its components.

12 C. For the purposes of medical care, including organ
13 transplants, the authorized use of marijuana by a medical marijuana
14 license holder shall be considered the equivalent of the use of any
15 other medication under the direction of a physician and does not
16 constitute the use of an illicit substance or otherwise disqualify a
17 registered qualifying patient from medical care.

18 D. No medical marijuana license holder may be denied custody of
19 or visitation or parenting time with a minor, and there is no
20 presumption of neglect or child endangerment for conduct allowed
21 under this law, unless the behavior of the person creates an
22 unreasonable danger to the safety of the minor.

23 E. No ~~person holding a~~ medical marijuana license holder may be
24 unduly ~~be~~ withheld from holding a state-issued license by virtue of

1 ~~their~~ being a medical marijuana license holder including, but not
2 limited to, a concealed carry permit.

3 F. 1. No city or local municipality may unduly change or
4 restrict zoning laws to prevent the opening of a retail marijuana
5 establishment.

6 2. For purposes of this subsection, an undue change or
7 restriction of municipal zoning laws means an act which entirely
8 prevents retail marijuana establishments from operating within
9 municipal boundaries as a matter of law. Municipalities may follow
10 their standard planning and zoning procedures to determine if
11 certain zones or districts would be appropriate for locating
12 marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana businesses or any
13 other premises where marijuana or its by-products are cultivated,
14 grown, processed, stored or manufactured.

15 3. For purposes of this section, "retail marijuana
16 establishment" means an entity licensed by the State Department of
17 Health as a medical marijuana dispensary. Retail marijuana
18 establishment does not include those ~~other~~ entities licensed by the
19 Department as marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana
20 businesses or other facilities or locations where marijuana or any
21 product containing marijuana or its by-products are cultivated,
22 grown, processed, stored or manufactured.

23 G. The location of any retail marijuana establishment is
24 specifically prohibited within one thousand (1,000) feet of any

1 public or private school entrance. Upon the effective date of this
2 act, the distance indicated in this subsection shall be measured
3 from the nearest property line of the public or private school to
4 the front entrance of the retail marijuana establishment.

5 H. Research shall be provided for under this law. A researcher
6 may apply to the State Department of Health for a special research
7 license. The license shall be granted, provided the applicant meets
8 the criteria listed under subsection B of Section 421 of this title.
9 Research license holders shall be required to file monthly
10 consumption reports to the State Department of Health with amounts
11 of marijuana used for research.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 509, O.S.L.
13 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 426.1), is amended to read as
14 follows:

15 Section 426.1 A. Except for revocation hearings concerning
16 licensed patients, as defined in Section ~~2 of Enrolled House Bill~~
17 ~~No. 2612 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature~~ 427.2
18 of this title, all licensure revocation hearings conducted pursuant
19 to marijuana licenses established in the Oklahoma Statutes shall be
20 recorded. A party may request a copy of the recording of the
21 proceedings. Copies shall be provided to local law enforcement if
22 the revocation was based on alleged criminal activity.

23 B. The State Department of Health shall assist any law
24 enforcement officer in the performance of his or her duties upon

1 such request by the law enforcement officer or the request of other
2 local officials having jurisdiction. Except for license information
3 concerning licensed patients, as defined in Section ~~2 of Enrolled~~
4 ~~House Bill No. 2612 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma~~
5 ~~Legislature~~ 427.2 of this title, the Department shall share
6 information with law enforcement agencies upon request without a
7 subpoena or search warrant.

8 C. The State Department of Health shall make available all
9 information displayed on medical marijuana licenses, as well as
10 whether or not the license is valid, to law enforcement
11 electronically through the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
12 Telecommunications System.

13 D. The Department shall make available to political
14 subdivisions a list of marijuana-licensed premises, medical
15 marijuana businesses or any other premises where marijuana or its
16 by-products are licensed to be cultivated, grown, processed, stored
17 or manufactured to aid county and municipal governments in
18 identifying locations within their jurisdiction and ensure
19 compliance with local regulations.

20 E. ~~All~~ If located within the incorporated boundaries of any
21 city or town, all marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana
22 businesses or any other premises where marijuana or its by-products
23 are licensed to be cultivated, grown, processed, stored or
24 manufactured shall submit with their application, after notifying

1 the ~~political subdivision~~ municipal government of their intent, a
2 certificate of compliance from the ~~political subdivision~~ municipal
3 government where the facility of the applicant or use is to be
4 located certifying compliance with zoning classifications,
5 applicable municipal ordinances and all applicable safety,
6 electrical, fire, plumbing, waste, construction and building
7 specification codes. Once a certificate of compliance has been
8 submitted to the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority showing full
9 compliance as outlined in this section, no additional certificate of
10 compliance shall be required for license renewal unless a change of
11 use or occupancy occurs, or there is any change concerning the
12 facility or location that would by law require additional
13 inspection, licensure or permitting by the state or municipal
14 government.

15 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 14, Chapter 11, O.S.L.
16 2019, as amended by Section 9, Chapter 477, O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S.
17 Supp. 2019, Section 427.14), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 427.14 A. There is hereby created the medical
19 marijuana business license, which shall include the following
20 categories:

- 21 1. Medical marijuana commercial grower;
- 22 2. Medical marijuana processor;
- 23 3. Medical marijuana dispensary;
- 24 4. Medical marijuana transporter; and

1 5. Medical marijuana testing laboratory.

2 B. The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority, with the aid of
3 the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, shall develop a
4 website for medical marijuana business applications.

5 C. The Authority shall make available on its website in an
6 easy-to-find location, applications for a medical marijuana
7 business.

8 D. The nonrefundable application fee for a medical marijuana
9 business license shall be Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
10 (\$2,500.00).

11 E. All applicants seeking licensure as a medical marijuana
12 business shall comply with the following general requirements:

13 1. All applications for licenses and registrations authorized
14 pursuant to this section shall be made upon forms prescribed by the
15 Authority;

16 2. Each application shall identify the city or county in which
17 the applicant seeks to obtain licensure as a medical marijuana
18 business;

19 3. Applicants shall submit a complete application to the
20 Department before the application may be accepted or considered;

21 4. All applications shall be complete and accurate in every
22 detail;

1 5. All applications shall include all attachments or
2 supplemental information required by the forms supplied by the
3 Authority;

4 6. All applications shall be accompanied by a full remittance
5 for the whole amount of the application fees. Application fees are
6 nonrefundable;

7 7. All applicants shall be approved for licensing review that,
8 at a minimum, meets the following criteria:

- 9 a. all applicants shall be age twenty-five (25) or older,
- 10 b. any applicant applying as an individual shall show
11 proof that the applicant is an Oklahoma resident
12 pursuant to paragraph 11 of this subsection,
- 13 c. any applicant applying as an entity shall show that
14 seventy-five percent (75%) of all members, managers,
15 executive officers, partners, board members or any
16 other form of business ownership are Oklahoma
17 residents pursuant to paragraph 11 of this subsection,
- 18 d. all applying individuals or entities shall be
19 registered to conduct business in the State of
20 Oklahoma,
- 21 e. all applicants shall disclose all ownership interests
22 pursuant to this act, and
- 23 f. applicants shall not have been convicted of a
24 nonviolent felony in the last two (2) years, and any

1 other felony conviction within the last five (5)
2 years, shall not be current inmates, or currently
3 incarcerated in a jail or corrections facility;

4 8. There shall be no limit to the number of medical marijuana
5 business licenses or categories that an individual or entity can
6 apply for or receive, although each application and each category
7 shall require a separate application and application fee. A
8 commercial grower, processor and dispensary, or any combination
9 thereof, are authorized to share the same address or physical
10 location, subject to the restrictions set forth in ~~this act~~ the
11 Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act;

12 9. All applicants for a medical marijuana business license,
13 research facility license or education facility license authorized
14 by this act shall undergo an Oklahoma criminal history background
15 check conducted by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI)
16 within thirty (30) days prior to the application for the license,
17 including:

- 18 a. individual applicants applying on their own behalf,
- 19 b. individuals applying on behalf of an entity,
- 20 c. all principal officers of an entity, and
- 21 d. all owners of an entity as defined by this act;

22 10. All applicable fees charged by OSBI are the responsibility
23 of the applicant and shall not be higher than fees charged to any
24 other person or industry for such background checks;

1 11. In order to be considered an Oklahoma resident for purposes
2 of a medical marijuana business application, all applicants shall
3 provide proof of Oklahoma residency for at least two (2) years
4 immediately preceding the date of application or five (5) years of
5 continuous Oklahoma residency during the preceding twenty-five (25)
6 years immediately preceding the date of application. Sufficient
7 documentation of proof of residency shall include a combination of
8 the following:

- 9 a. an unexpired Oklahoma-issued driver license,
- 10 b. an Oklahoma voter identification card,
- 11 c. a utility bill preceding the date of application,
12 excluding cellular telephone and Internet bills,
- 13 d. a residential property deed to property in the State
14 of Oklahoma, and
- 15 e. a rental agreement preceding the date of application
16 for residential property located in the State of
17 Oklahoma.

18 Applicants that were issued a medical marijuana business license
19 prior to the enactment of the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient
20 Protection Act are hereby exempt from the two-year or five-year
21 Oklahoma residency requirement mentioned above;

22 12. All license applicants shall be required to submit a
23 registration with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
24

1 Dangerous Drugs Control as provided in Sections 2-302 through 2-304
2 of ~~Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes~~ this title;

3 13. All applicants shall establish their identity through
4 submission of a color copy or digital image of one of the following
5 unexpired documents:

- 6 a. front and back of an Oklahoma driver license,
- 7 b. front and back of an Oklahoma identification card,
- 8 c. a United States passport or other photo identification
9 issued by the United States government,
- 10 d. certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate
11 for minor applicants who do not possess a document
12 listed in this section, or
- 13 e. a tribal identification card approved for
14 identification purposes by the Oklahoma Department of
15 Public Safety; and

16 14. All applicants shall submit an applicant photograph.

17 F. The Authority shall review the medical marijuana business
18 application, approve or reject the application and mail the
19 approval, rejection or status-update letter to the applicant within
20 ninety (90) business days of receipt of the application.

21 G. 1. The Authority shall review the medical marijuana
22 business applications and conduct all investigations, inspections
23 and interviews before approving the application.

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1 2. Approved applicants shall be issued a medical marijuana
2 business license for the specific category applied under which shall
3 act as proof of their approved status. Rejection letters shall
4 provide a reason for the rejection. Applications may only be
5 rejected based on the applicant not meeting the standards set forth
6 in the provisions of this section, improper completion of the
7 application, or for a reason provided for in this act. If an
8 application is rejected for failure to provide required information,
9 the applicant shall have thirty (30) days to submit the required
10 information for reconsideration. No additional application fee
11 shall be charged for such reconsideration.

12 3. Status-update letters shall provide a reason for delay in
13 either approval or rejection should a situation arise in which an
14 application was submitted properly, but a delay in processing the
15 application occurred.

16 4. Approval, rejection or status-update letters shall be sent
17 to the applicant in the same method the application was submitted to
18 the Department.

19 H. ~~A license provided by this act or by Section 421, 422, 423~~
20 ~~or 425 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall not be issued~~
21 ~~until all relevant local licenses and permits have been issued by~~
22 ~~the municipality, including but not limited to an occupancy permit~~
23 ~~or certificate of compliance.~~

24

1 ~~I. In the event that an applicant has not received the~~
2 ~~necessary permits, certificates or licenses from a municipality, but~~
3 ~~the applicant has fulfilled all other obligations required by this~~
4 ~~act, the Authority shall grant a conditional license. A conditional~~
5 ~~license shall remain valid for a period of one (1) year or until the~~
6 ~~applicant obtains the necessary local permits, certificates or~~
7 ~~licenses. An applicant shall not transfer any medical marijuana,~~
8 ~~concentrate or products to a medical marijuana business, patient or~~
9 ~~caregiver until approval is received from the Authority.~~

10 ~~J.~~ A medical marijuana business license shall not be issued to
11 or held by:

12 1. A person until all required fees have been paid;

13 2. A person who has been convicted of a nonviolent felony
14 within two (2) years of the date of application, or within five (5)
15 years for any other felony;

16 3. A corporation, if the criminal history of any of its
17 officers, directors or stockholders indicates that the officer,
18 director or stockholder has been convicted of a nonviolent felony
19 within two (2) years of the date of application, or within five (5)
20 years for any other felony;

21 4. A person under twenty-five (25) years of age;

22 5. A person licensed pursuant to this section who, during a
23 period of licensure, or who, at the time of application, has failed
24 to:

1 a. file taxes, interest or penalties due related to a
2 medical marijuana business, or

3 b. pay taxes, interest or penalties due related to a
4 medical marijuana business;

5 6. A sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer or prosecuting
6 officer, or an officer or employee of the Authority ~~or municipality~~;
7 or

8 7. A person whose authority to be a caregiver as defined in
9 this act has been revoked by the Department.

10 ~~K.~~ I. In investigating the qualifications of an applicant or a
11 licensee, the Department, Authority and municipalities may have
12 access to criminal history record information furnished by a
13 criminal justice agency subject to any restrictions imposed by such
14 an agency. In the event the Department considers the criminal
15 history record of the applicant, the Department shall also consider
16 any information provided by the applicant regarding such criminal
17 history record, including but not limited to evidence of
18 rehabilitation, character references and educational achievements,
19 especially those items pertaining to the period of time between the
20 last criminal conviction of the applicant and the consideration of
21 the application for a state license.

22 ~~L.~~ J. The failure of an applicant to provide the requested
23 information by the Authority deadline may be grounds for denial of
24 the application.

1 ~~M.~~ K. All applicants shall submit information to the Department
2 and Authority in a full, faithful, truthful and fair manner. The
3 Department and Authority may recommend denial of an application
4 where the applicant made misstatements, omissions,
5 misrepresentations or untruths in the application or in connection
6 with the background investigation of the applicant. This type of
7 conduct may be considered as the basis for additional administrative
8 action against the applicant. Typos and scrivener errors shall not
9 be grounds for denial.

10 ~~N.~~ L. A licensed medical marijuana business premises shall be
11 subject to and responsible for compliance with applicable provisions
12 for medical marijuana business facilities as described in the most
13 recent versions of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code, the
14 International Building Code and the International Fire Code, unless
15 granted an exemption by the Authority or municipality.

16 ~~O.~~ M. All medical marijuana business licensees shall pay the
17 relevant licensure fees prior to receiving licensure to operate a
18 medical marijuana business, as defined in this act for each class of
19 license.

20 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 18, Chapter 11, O.S.L.
21 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 427.18), is amended to read as
22 follows:

23 Section 427.18 A. An Oklahoma medical marijuana business shall
24 not sell, transfer or otherwise distribute medical marijuana or

1 medical marijuana product that has not been packaged and labeled in
2 accordance with this section and rules promulgated by the State
3 Commissioner of Health.

4 B. A medical marijuana dispensary shall return medical
5 marijuana and medical marijuana product that does not meet packaging
6 or labeling requirements in this section or rules promulgated
7 pursuant thereto to the entity who transferred it to the dispensary.
8 The medical marijuana dispensary shall document to whom the item was
9 returned, what was returned and the date of the return or dispose of
10 any usable marijuana that does not meet these requirements in
11 accordance with this ~~act~~ section.

12 C. 1. Medical marijuana packaging shall be packaged to
13 minimize its appeal to children and shall not depict images other
14 than the business name logo of the medical marijuana producer and
15 image of the product.

16 2. A medical marijuana business shall not place any content on
17 a container in a manner that reasonably appears to target
18 individuals under the age of twenty-one (21), including but not
19 limited to cartoon characters or similar images.

20 3. Labels on a container shall not include any false or
21 misleading statements.

22 4. No container shall be intentionally or knowingly labeled so
23 as to cause a reasonable patient confusion as to whether the medical
24 marijuana, medical marijuana concentrate or medical marijuana

1 product is a trademarked product or labeled in a manner that
2 violates any federal trademark law or regulation.

3 5. The label on the container shall not make any claims
4 regarding health or physical benefits to the patient.

5 6. All medical marijuana, medical marijuana concentrate and
6 medical marijuana products ~~shall be in a~~ sold at medical marijuana
7 dispensaries may be packaged in any type of container that is
8 generally recognized as safe for use and protects the product
9 against foreseeable external factors that can cause deterioration or
10 contamination of the product; provided, however, the product shall
11 not be packaged in any type of plastic sandwich bag, one-use zipper
12 or slider storage bag or plastic or cling wrap and must be placed in
13 opaque packaging that is child-resistant container at the point of
14 transfer to, as such term is defined in Section 427.2 of this title,
15 at the point of final sale to the licensed patient or licensed
16 caregiver.

17 D. The State Department of Health shall develop minimum
18 standards for packaging and labeling of medical marijuana and
19 medical marijuana products. Such standards shall include, but not
20 be limited to, the required contents of labels to be affixed to all
21 medical marijuana and medical marijuana products prior to transfer
22 to a licensed patient or caregiver, which shall include, at a
23 minimum:

24

- 1 1. A universal symbol indicating that the product contains
2 tetrahydrocannabinol (THC);
- 3 2. THC and other cannabinoid potency, and terpenoid potency;
- 4 3. A statement indicating that the product has been tested for
5 contaminants;
- 6 4. One or more product warnings to be determined by the
7 Department; and
- 8 5. Any other information the Department deems necessary.

9 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 427.24 of Title 63, unless there
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 A. A person who is not a resident of the State of Oklahoma, but
13 who is authorized to engage in the medical use of marijuana under
14 the laws of his or her state of residence, is deemed to hold a valid
15 medical marijuana license for the purpose of the exemption from
16 arrest, prosecution or penalty described in subsection F of Section
17 427.8 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, if the person abides by
18 the legal limits on the possession of marijuana for medical purposes
19 in this state as set forth in Section 420 of Title 63 of the
20 Oklahoma Statutes.

21 B. A licensed medical marijuana dispensary may dispense
22 marijuana to a person described in subsection A of this section if
23 the person presents to the medical marijuana dispensary a valid
24

1 medical marijuana certification or license from his or her state of
2 residence.

3 C. The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority shall maintain and
4 publish a list of other states that authorize the medical use of
5 marijuana and images of the medical marijuana certifications or
6 licenses from those states. The Authority shall make that
7 information available to licensed medical marijuana dispensaries for
8 purposes of verification.

9 D. A licensed medical marijuana dispensary that fails to verify
10 the authenticity and status of an out-of-state medical marijuana
11 certification or license prior to conducting a marijuana transaction
12 shall be subject to the following penalties:

13 1. A fine in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a
14 first offense;

15 2. A fine in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for
16 a second offense; and

17 3. Revocation or suspension of the medical marijuana dispensary
18 license for a third and subsequent offense.

19 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
