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1 which was validly issued marks, alterations, or stored information, 2 or when the person alters a credit, debit, or similar card containing a magnetic stripe capable of storing data which was 3 originally authorized and issued, including but not limited to when 4 5 a person manipulates information included on an electronic magnetic 6 stripe or chip contained on a card. A person "falsely embosses" a credit card or debit card 7 when, without the authorization of the named issuer, the person 8 9 completes a credit card or debit card by adding any of the matter, 10 other than the signature of the cardholder, which an issuer requires to appear on the credit card or debit card before it can be used by 11 12 a cardholder A person in violation of the provisions of this section, while 13 in possession of: 14 1. Five or fewer falsely made cards shall be guilty of a felony 15 punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of 16 17 Corrections for a term not less than two (2) years and not more than five (5) years, and by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars 18 (\$5,000.00). 19 2. Six or more but less than twenty (20) falsely made cards 20 shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the 21 custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not less than 22 five (5) years and not more than ten (10) years, and by a fine not 23 to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). 24

1	3. Twenty or more falsely made cards shall be guilty of a
2	felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department
3	of Corrections for a term of not less than ten (10) years and not
4	more than twenty (20) years, and by a fine not to exceed One Hundred
5	Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00).
