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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-100.1 of Title 29, unless
 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

## LICENSES

5 A. Except as otherwise provided by this act, no person shall hunt, pursue, trap, harass, catch, kill, take or attempt to take in 6 7 any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or transport all or any portion of any wildlife, including fish, or enter any land owned, 8 9 leased, or managed by the Department of Wildlife Conservation unless 10 the person has first obtained a license, permit, or stamp from the 11 Director of the Department or any authorized agent of the 12 Department.

B. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall prescribe, by rule, the form, type, design, manner of issuance, and the fees for such licenses, permits, and stamps; and any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section; provided that the Commission shall offer, but not be limited to, a three-hundredsixty-five-day hunting and fishing license.

C. The Commission may, by rule or resolution, designate
 discounts, sales, or exemptions to any license, permit, and stamp.
 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-100.2 of Title 29, unless
 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 LICENSES FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES

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A. Except as otherwise provided in this act, no person shall
breed, possess, or raise, sell, buy, or transport out of state,
export, take, accompany, transport, outfit, guide, or aid persons in
taking for commercial purposes any wildlife, including fish, without
first having procured a license for such purposes from the Director
of the Department of Wildlife Conservation pursuant to the rules
promulgated by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission.

B. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
prescribe, by rule, the form, type, design, manner of issuance, and
the fees for such licenses, permits, and stamps; and any rules
necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

12 C. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this 13 section shall:

14 1. Have the commercial license revoked and forfeit the 15 privileges provided by the license. No new license shall be issued 16 for a period of at least one (1) year from and after the date on 17 which the revocation order becomes effective; and

2. Be punished by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars
(\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not
to exceed six (6) months, or by confiscation of gear, or by a
combination of fine, imprisonment, and confiscation.

22 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-100.3 of Title 29, unless 24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

LICENSES FOR NONCOMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES INVOLVING WILDLIFE
 A. Except as otherwise provided in this title or in the
 Oklahoma Farmed Cervidae Act, no person may breed or raise wildlife
 for personal consumption or noncommercial purposes, or kill or
 capture wildlife or take their nests or eggs for scientific purposes
 without having first procured a license from the Director of the
 Department of Wildlife Conservation.

B. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
prescribe, by rule, the form, type, design, manner of issuance, and
the fees for such licenses, permits, and stamps; and any rules
necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

12 C. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this 13 section shall:

14 1. Have the noncommercial license revoked and forfeit the 15 privileges provided by the license. No new license shall be issued 16 for a period of at least six (6) months from and after the date on 17 which the revocation order becomes effective; and

Be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars
 (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-100.4 of Title 29, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: FISHING LICENSE AUTHORITY

AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-101, is amended to read as follows: 12 13 Section 4-101. A. All licenses and permits issued by the 14 Director of Wildlife Conservation, the Department of Wildlife 15 Conservation or by any of its agents shall be used only in 16 conformity with the provisions of this title and the rules 17 promulgated by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission. 18 B. All persons making application for any licenses required by 19 this section shall produce a valid license to operate a motor 20 vehicle or other positive proof of identification, age and

21 residency, and any such license issued shall show such data as well 22 as the date and time of issuance.

C. All licenses are nontransferable. No person shall alter,
 change, lend or transfer any license. No person shall use or borrow

a license which has not been issued to that person by the Director,
 the Department or by any of its agents pursuant to the provisions of
 this section.

D. No person may engage in activities requiring a license
without that person's carrying such license on their person and
producing the same for an inspection upon the demand of any Oklahoma
citizen or game warden.

8 E. Any person required to produce a license must also identify 9 themselves as the person to whom such license was issued, and 10 failure or refusal to comply shall be deemed prima facie evidence of 11 a violation of this section.

12 F. Unless otherwise provided in this Code:

13 1. Hunting licenses issued pursuant to paragraph 1 of 14 subsection C and paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection E of Section 4-112 15 of this title and paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection B of Section 4-16 113 of this title shall expire on December 31 of the year issued. 17 Hunting licenses issued pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection C and 18 paragraphs 2 and 4 of subsection E of Section 4-112 of this title 19 and paragraphs 2 and 4 of subsection B of Section 4-113 of this 20 title shall expire on June 30 of the fiscal year issued. All other 21 licenses shall terminate December 31 for the year issued; and 22 2. Any, any person convicted of violating any of the provisions 23 of this title may have any or all licenses held by that person or 24 the privilege of applying for, purchasing or exercising the benefits

conferred by the licenses revoked by the Department in accordance with rules promulgated by the Commission or by a court of competent jurisdiction for a period of not less than one (1) year. For purposes of this paragraph, a court conviction, a plea of guilty, a plea of nolo contendere, the imposition of a deferred or suspended sentence by a court, or forfeiture of bond shall be deemed a conviction.

G. Should any license or permit issued pursuant to Part 1 of
Article IV of this title be lost or destroyed, duplicates will shall
be issued by the Department at a fee of One Dollar and fifty cents
(\$1.50) determined by the Commission.

H. Upon harvesting any whitetail or mule deer, or any other wildlife where the hunter, according to Commission rules, is required to check the wildlife in at a Department check station, the taker of the wildlife shall:

16 1. Securely attach the name of the taker, time of harvest, date 17 of harvest and license number to the carcass of the wildlife; 18 2. Check in the carcass of the wildlife electronically using 19 the online check station provided on the official website of the 20 Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation or as prescribed by 21 rule of the Commission, within twenty-four (24) hours of leaving the 22 hunt area and in all cases prior to processing the carcass; and 23 3. Not remove evidence of the sex of the animal until after the 24 carcass of the animal has been checked in.

1 I. It shall be unlawful for any license or permit holder to 2 knowingly make a false statement or give false information to any authorized hunter check station or to an authorized Department 3 4 employee when complying with the provisions of subsection H of this 5 section. Information which may be collected at a Department check station shall include but not be limited to the name, address, 6 7 license or permit number and signature of the taker, the date, time, county, method or weapon of the kill, sex and weight of carcass, 8 9 whether or not the animal was taken on public hunting land and if so 10 in what area, or any other information which may be required by the 11 Commission.

J. 1. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this 12 13 section or of making a false statement or giving any false 14 information in order to acquire any license or permit, pursuant to 15 the provisions of this section, shall be punishable by a fine of not 16 less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Two Hundred 17 Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a 18 period not to exceed ten (10) days, or by both such fine and 19 imprisonment. Any person convicted of a second or subsequent 20 violation of the provisions of this section or of making a false 21 statement or giving any false information in order to acquire any 22 license or permit, pursuant to the provisions of this section, shall 23 be punishable by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars 24 (\$250.00) nor more than Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00), or by

1 imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed ten (10)
2 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

3 2. Any hunting or fishing license issued to a person by the 4 Department of Wildlife Conservation shall be automatically revoked 5 upon conviction of the person of violating the provisions of this section. The revocation shall be for a period set by the court of 6 7 not less than one (1) year nor more than ten (10) years. If the court does not set a period, the revocation shall be for one (1) 8 9 year from the date of the conviction. During this period of 10 revocation, the Department shall not issue the person a hunting or 11 fishing license. If the court does not set a revocation period, the 12 Department shall not issue that person a license within one (1) year 13 of the conviction of the person pursuant to this section. A person 14 who has a license or permit revoked pursuant to this section shall 15 surrender the revoked license or permit to the court, or the court 16 may order the defendant to surrender the license or permit directly 17 to an officer from the Department of Wildlife Conservation present 18 at the hearing. If the license or permit is surrendered to the 19 court, the court shall send the Department of Wildlife Conservation 20 the revoked license. The court shall also send the Department a 21 copy of the judgment of conviction. For purposes of this section, 22 "conviction" shall include a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to an 23 offense or the imposition of deferred adjudication for an offense. 24 In lieu of sending a paper copy of the documents and information

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required by this subsection, the court clerk may transmit the
 conviction information by using an electronic method authorized by
 the Department of Wildlife Conservation.

4 Any person who has had their license privileges revoked Κ. 5 shall not be entitled to purchase, apply for, or exercise the benefits conferred by any license until the revocation period has 6 7 expired or the person has obtained approval from the Director. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection, upon conviction, 8 9 shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars 10 (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in a county jail for a term of not more than ninety (90) days or by both the fine and imprisonment. 11 12 Upon conviction under this subsection, the previously granted 13 license revocation period shall be extended by two (2) additional 14 years.

15 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-110, is 16 amended to read as follows:

Section 4-110. A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code, no person shall fish, pursue, harass, catch, kill, take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or transport all or any portion of fish without having first procured a license for such from the Director or from any of the authorized agents of the Department of Wildlife Conservation. The Wildlife Conservation Commission may designate two (2) days per year in which

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residents and nonresidents may fish without first procuring a
 fishing license pursuant to the provisions of this section.

B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma shall be exempt
from the annual fishing license requirements of subsection C of this
section and the following nonresidents shall be exempt from the
annual nonresident fishing licenses required pursuant to subsection
E of this section:

8 1. Legal residents under sixteen (16) years of age and 9 nonresidents under sixteen (16) years of age from states which do 10 not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons under sixteen 11 (16) years of age;

12 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older and 13 nonresidents sixty-five (65) years of age or older from states which 14 do not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons sixty-five 15 (65) years of age or older, provided a legal resident has obtained a 16 senior citizen lifetime fishing or combination hunting and fishing 17 license pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-114 of this title; 18 3. Legal residents born on or before January 1, 1923; 19 4. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent 20 (60%) or more and registered with the veterans registry created by 21 the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; provided, that if the 22 veteran has previously received an exemption pursuant to this 23 paragraph, no registration with the veterans registry shall be

1 promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this
2 paragraph;

4	grandparents, children and their spouses, grandchildren and their

6	6. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a patient of an
7	institution of the State of Oklahoma established for the care and
8	treatment of mental illness or alcohol or drug dependency or any
9	developmentally disabled person residing in any group home or other
10	institution or developmentally disabled persons when accompanied by
11	an attendant of the institution or legal guardian of the patient, or
12	when fishing on institutional property;
13	7. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
14	of age who is in the legal and physical custody of the State of
15	Oklahoma or one of its agencies by court order;
16	8. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
17	of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
18	defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
19	9. Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or
20	who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician
21	licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which
22	prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without
23	the assistance of another person, and any one person actually
24	accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise

1	physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This
2	certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing;
3	10. Nonresidents under fourteen (14) years of age;
4	11. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a Job Corps
5	traince of this state, provided that the trainces shall have on
6	their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their
7	respective Job Corps Center and shall present the card upon request,
8	in lieu of a fishing license. The trainces shall return their cards
9	to their respective Job Corps Center when the trainees leave their
10	respective Job Corps training programs;
11	12. Any legal resident having a proven disability which renders
12	the resident nonambulatory and confined to a wheelchair as certified
13	by a physician licensed in this state or any state which borders
14	this state;
