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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 887.12, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 887.12 A. 1. Except as otherwise provided by the
16	Physical Therapy Practice Act, all licenses shall expire on January
17	31 of each year. A license may be renewed during the month of
18	January of each year upon:
19	a. application,
20	b. evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of
21	continuing education or of alternative requirements,
22	as required by the State Board of Medical Licensure
23	and Supervision pursuant to subsection B of this
24	section, and

c. payment of fees.

- 2. Applications for renewal of licensure shall be sent by the Board to all licensed physical therapists and physical therapist assistants at their last-known address. Failure to renew a license three (3) months after notification shall effect a forfeiture of the license granted pursuant to the provisions of the Physical Therapy Practice Act. Upon recommendation of the Board, a lapsed license may be revived upon the payment of all unpaid registration fees and pursuant to such rules as may be promulgated by the Board.
- 3. A physical therapist or physical therapist assistant who fails to apply for a renewal of a license for five (5) years may renew the license by complying with the provisions of the Physical Therapy Practice Act relating to the issuance of an original license.
- B. For physical therapists and physical therapist assistants, the Board shall establish by rule the requirements for:
- 1. A program of continuing education; provided, there shall be no requirement that any continuing education hours be obtained through live courses; and
- 2. Alternative requirements to establish continuing competence to practice.

The Board shall also establish by rule the minimum hours of continuing education needed to satisfy these requirements, with a requirement of forty (40) hours every two (2) years of continuing

1	education for physical therapists and twenty (20) hours every two
2	(2) years of continuing education for physical therapist assistants.
3	In establishing these requirements, the Board shall consider any
4	existing programs of continuing education currently being offered to
5	licensed physical therapists or physical therapist assistants.
6	C. If a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant
7	fails to complete the required continuing education hours pursuant
8	to subsection B of this section, the Board may:
9	1. Fine the physical therapist or physical therapist assistant
10	in an amount not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00); or
11	2. Suspend the physical therapist's or physical therapist
12	assistant's license. The Board shall reinstate the license upon
13	completion of the continuing education hours remaining from the
14	previous cycle of required hours.
15	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
