13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 18b, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 18b. A. The duties of the Attorney General as the
16	chief law officer of the state shall be:
17	1. To appear for the state and prosecute and defend all actions
18	and proceedings, civil or criminal, in the Supreme Court and Court
19	of Criminal Appeals in which the state is interested as a party;
20	2. To appear for the state and prosecute and defend all actions
21	and proceedings in any of the federal courts in which the state is
22	interested as a party;
23	3. To initiate or appear in any action in which the interests
24	of the state or the people of the state are at issue, or to appear

9 4. To consult with and advise district attorneys, when
10 requested by them, in all matters pertaining to the duties of their
11 offices, when the district attorneys shall furnish the Attorney
12 General with a written opinion supported by citation of authorities
13 upon the matter submitted;

To give an opinion in writing upon all questions of law 5. 14 submitted to the Attorney General by the Legislature or either 15 branch thereof, or by any state officer, board, commission or 16 department, provided, that the Attorney General shall not furnish 17 opinions to any but district attorneys, the Legislature or either 18 branch thereof, or any other state official, board, commission or 19 department, and to them only upon matters in which they are 20 officially interested; 21

6. At the request of the Governor, State Auditor and Inspector,
State Treasurer, or either branch of the Legislature, to prosecute
any official bond or any contract in which the state is interested,

7. Whenever requested by any state officer, board or
commission, to prepare proper drafts for contracts, forms and other
writing which may be wanted for the use of the state;

8. To prepare drafts of bills and resolutions for individual
members of the Legislature upon their written request stating the
gist of the bill or resolution desired;

9. To enforce the proper application of monies appropriated by
the Legislature and to prosecute breaches of trust in the
administration of such funds;

13 10. To institute actions to recover state monies illegally 14 expended, to recover state property and to prevent the illegal use 15 of any state property, upon the request of the Governor or the 16 Legislature;

17 11. To pay into the State Treasury, immediately upon its 18 receipt, all monies received by the Attorney General belonging to 19 the state;

20 12. To settle, compromise and dispose of an action in which the 21 Attorney General represents the interests of the state, so long as 22 the consideration negotiated for such settlement, compromise or 23 disposition is payable to the state or one of its agencies which is

2 item of value is paid first to the State Treasury;

3 13. To keep and file copies of all opinions, contracts, forms 4 and letters of the office, and to keep an index of all opinions, 5 contracts and forms according to subject and section of the law 6 construed or applied;

7 14. To keep a register or docket of all actions, demands and 8 investigations prosecuted, defended or conducted by the Attorney 9 General in behalf of the state. The register or docket shall give 10 the style of the case or investigation, where pending, court number, 11 office number, the gist of the matter, result and the names of the 12 assistants who handled the matter;

13 15. To keep a complete office file of all cases and 14 investigations handled by the Attorney General on behalf of the 15 state;

16 16. To report to the Legislature or either branch thereof 17 whenever requested upon any business relating to the duties of the 18 Attorney General's office;

19 17. To institute civil actions against members of any state 20 board or commission for failure of such members to perform their 21 duties as prescribed by the statutes and the Constitution and to 22 prosecute members of any state board or commission for violation of 23 the criminal laws of this state where such violations have occurred 24 in connection with the performance of such members' official duties;

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18. To respond to any request for an opinion of the Attorney
 General's office, submitted by a member of the Legislature,
 regardless of subject matter, by written opinion determinative of
 the law regarding such subject matter;

5 19. To convene multicounty grand juries in such manner and for 6 such purposes as provided by law; provided, such grand juries are 7 composed of citizens from each of the counties on a pro rata basis 8 by county;

9 20. To investigate any report by the State Auditor and 10 Inspector filed with the Attorney General pursuant to Section 223 of 11 this title and prosecute all actions, civil or criminal, relating to 12 such reports or any irregularities or derelictions in the management 13 of public funds or property which are violations of the laws of this 14 state;

15 21. To represent and protect the collective interests of all 16 utility consumers of this state in rate-related proceedings before 17 the Corporation Commission or in any other state or federal judicial 18 or administrative proceeding;

19 22. To represent and protect the collective interests of 20 insurance consumers of this state in rate-related proceedings before 21 the Insurance Commissioner or in any other state or federal judicial 22 or administrative proceeding;

23 23. To investigate and prosecute any criminal action relating24 to insurance fraud, if in the opinion of the Attorney General a

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1 criminal prosecution is warranted, or to refer such matters to the 2 appropriate district attorney; and

24. To monitor and evaluate any action by the federal
government including, but not limited to, executive orders by the
President of the United States, rules or regulations promulgated by
an agency of the federal government or acts of Congress to determine
if such actions are in violation of the Tenth Amendment to the
Constitution of the United States; and

To maintain data related to human trafficking and to assist 10 law enforcement, social service agencies, and victim services 11 programs in identifying and supporting victims of human trafficking. 12 B. Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring the Attorney General to appear and defend or prosecute in any court any 13 cause or proceeding for or on behalf of the Oklahoma Tax Commission, 14 the Board of Managers of the State Insurance Fund, or the 15 Commissioners of the Land Office. 16

С. In all appeals from the Corporation Commission to the 17 Supreme Court of Oklahoma in which the state is a party, the 18 Attorney General shall have the right to designate counsel of the 19 Corporation Commission as the Attorney General's legally appointed 20 representative in such appeals, and it shall be the duty of the 21 Corporation Commission counsel to act when so designated and to 22 consult and advise with the Attorney General regarding such appeals 23 prior to taking action therein. 24

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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18r of Title 74, unless there is
 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 There is hereby created within the Office of the Attorney5 General the Human Trafficking Response Unit, which shall:

1. Maintain data in a central location on human trafficking 6 that shall be shared with law enforcement, criminal justice 7 entities, social service agencies, and victim services programs and 8 9 document information including, but not limited to, offenders, 10 locations, victims, types of trafficking, and trafficking techniques. Provided, however, that any personal identifying 11 12 information shall be de-identified using tokens or a similar method prior to the sharing of data in order to protect individuals' 13 privacy rights; 14

Develop training programs that address prevention efforts
 and best practices on identifying and assisting victims of human
 trafficking and support agencies in identifying at-risk environments
 for human trafficking;

Review current state agency policies to ensure they include
 best practices to identify human trafficking victims and encourage
 reporting;

4. Create an incentive program to encourage state agencies tohave personnel attend training programs and review policies;

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1	5. Appropriate targeted funding for victim services programs;
2	and
3	6. Publish public service announcements on various media
4	platforms to educate the public about the dangers of human
5	trafficking.
6	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
7	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
