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6	AS INTRODUCED
7	An Act relating to teacher certification; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, which relates to criteria
8	for issuing teaching certificates; providing for issuance of advanced teaching certificates; modifying
9	procedures for issuing lead and master teaching certificates; establishing minimum salary increase
10	for certificates; providing for minimum time out of classroom; prescribing additional award for certain
11	teachers; directing school district to identify and designate teachers for specialized certificates;
12	requiring submission of plans to State Department of Education for evaluation and approval; providing
13	minimum requirements for district designation system; authorizing use of additional factors; requiring
14	state funding match; permitting districts to not participate in certain program; prescribing frequency
15	and timing of designation; providing for professional development cohorts and additional training;
16	mandating certain review of each district's system; requiring annual report of program; prescribing and
17	modifying contract terms for advanced, lead, and master teachers; providing for funding through
18	certain lottery monies; stating funding is on a first-come, first-served basis; clarifying certain
19	funding is a state match for local funds; updating statutory citations; providing an effective date;
20	declaring an emergency; and providing for conditional effect.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1SECTION 1.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101 of this title and by other law.

9 B. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person10 who:

Has successfully completed the teacher education program
 required by the Commission for Educational Quality and
 Accountability;

14 2. Has graduated from an accredited institution of higher
15 education that has approval or accreditation for teacher education;
16 3. Has met all other requirements as may be established by the
17 Board;

18 4. Has made the necessary application and paid the competency19 examination fee in an amount and as prescribed by the Commission;

20 5. Has successfully completed the competency examination 21 required in Section 6-187 of this title; and

6. Beginning November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a
current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State
Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history

record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history records.

7 C. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person 8 who:

9 1. Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements10 set forth in subsection G of this section;

Holds certification from the National Board for Professional
 Teaching Standards;

Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the
 requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or

4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in
the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets
the requirements set forth in subsection H of this section.

D. Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of

1 the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person 2 applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the 3 criminal history records.

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to
January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional
development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher
Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

9 F. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 10 who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any 11 requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach 12 shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely 13 aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-14 of-country certificate.

15 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 16 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 17 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 18 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-country 19 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma
criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of
Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as
defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon

1 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 2 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 3 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 4 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 5 cost of the criminal history record checks.

4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by
which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for
purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this
subsection.

10 G. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person 11 who holds a valid out-of-state certificate. The certificate to 12 teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most 13 closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on 14 the out-of-state certificate.

15 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 16 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 17 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 18 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state 19 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall
have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history
record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well
as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section
150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the

Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history record checks.

H. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person
who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority
of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for
those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a
certification area used in Oklahoma.

11 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 12 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 13 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 14 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 15 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 16 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 17 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 18 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 19 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 20 cost of the criminal history record checks.

21 I. <u>1.</u> The Board shall issue a lead teaching certificate to any 22 person who upon application:

23 1. Has successfully completed the requirements of this
24 subsection;

1	2. Has a minimum of five (5) years of experience as a teacher;
2	3. Participates in a meaningful individualized program of
3	professional development, as provided for in Section 6-101.10 of
4	this title;
5	4. Has earned a "highly effective" or "superior" rating
6	pursuant to Section 6-101.16 of this title; and
7	5. May have a teaching load of not more than seventy-five
8	percent (75%) student instruction to allow the teacher to mentor
9	other teachers.
10	J. 1. The Board shall issue a master teaching certificate to
11	any person who upon application:
12	a. has successfully completed the requirements of this
13	subsection,
14	b. has a minimum of seven (7) years of experience as a
15	teacher, and
16	c. (1) has carned a "superior" rating pursuant to
17	Section 6-101.16 of this title, or
18	(2) has carned a "highly effective" rating pursuant
19	to Section 6-101.16 of this title and holds or
20	has held a National Board certification from the
21	National Board for Professional Teaching
22	Standards.
23	2. Teachers with a master teaching certificate may assume
24	leadership roles that include but are not limited to:

1	a. the planning and delivery of professional development
2	activities designed to improve instructional
3	strategies,
4	b. the facilitation of an instructional leadership team
5	within the building or school district in which the
6	lead teacher is assigned, and
7	c. the mentoring of other teachers and participation in
8	evaluations of other teachers.
9	3. Teachers with a master teaching certificate may have a
10	teaching load of not more than fifty percent (50%) student
11	instruction to allow the lead teacher to spend time on:
12	a. co-teaching,
13	b. co-planning,
14	c. peer reviews, and
15	d. other duties mutually agreed upon by the
16	superintendent and the master teacher, and may be used
17	to satisfy the qualitative evaluation component for
18	teachers as required by Section 6-101.16 of this title
19	by performing the duties set forth in this paragraph
20	may establish new levels of teacher certificates: advanced, lead,
21	and master. Each level shall have a minimum salary increase
22	requirement paid by the school district, and matched with state
23	dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title
24	3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. The advanced certificate shall include

1	a minimum salary increase of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) and
2	out of classroom at least ten percent (10%) of the time, the lead
3	certificate shall include a minimum salary increase of Five Thousand
4	Dollars (\$5,000.00) and out of classroom at least twenty-five
5	percent (25%) of the time, and the master certificate shall include
6	a minimum salary increase of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and
7	maximum salary increase of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) and
8	out of classroom at least fifty percent (50%) of the time.
9	2. A teacher who works in a school designated to receive Title
10	I federal funds or a school district with an enrollment of less than
11	one thousand students shall be paid an award in addition to the
12	salary increases provided in paragraph 1 of this subsection:
13	a. One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for an
14	advanced certificate,
15	b. <u>Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for a</u>
16	lead certificate, and
17	<u>c.</u> <u>Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a master</u>
18	certificate.
19	3. School districts shall identify and designate the highest
20	quality teachers for advanced, lead, and master certificates. The
21	district shall submit its designation plans to the State Department
22	of Education for evaluation and approval. Districts shall have
23	local control and flexibility in determining how to evaluate
24	teachers and assign designations, but, at a minimum, the designation

2	<u>performance</u>	component.
3	<u>a.</u>	Teacher observation shall be based on the State
4		Department of Education's Teacher and Leader
5		Effectiveness (TLE) and Professional Learning Focus,
6		or a third-party rubric, such as the Tulsa Model,
7		Marzano, or nationally recognized teacher evaluation
8		systems such as the Framework for Teaching (FFT) from
9		Danielson, National Institute for Excellence in
10		Teaching TAP, or others. A school district may create
11		its own teacher evaluation rubric if it can show
12		evidence of validity and reliability as approved by
13		the Department.
14	b.	Student performance measures may be determined by the
15		district and may include pre- and post-tests,
16		summative or formative, value-added measures, student
17		learning objectives (SLOs), and portfolios. The
18		school district application shall show evidence of
19		validity and reliability of the measures.

20 <u>Districts may use additional factors in determining which</u>
21 <u>teachers are eligible to receive a designation, such as student</u>
22 <u>surveys, teacher leadership responsibilities, teacher mentorship</u>
23 <u>responsibilities, family surveys, demonstration of district core</u>

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1 values, teacher peer surveys, and contributions to the broader
2 school community.

3	4. If a school district chooses to participate in this program,
4	the state shall match the amount the district pays above base pay,
5	up to Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) per teacher.
6	5. School districts that create their own teacher evaluation
7	rubric may choose not to participate in state TLE for teachers
8	identified for advanced, lead, and master certificate designations.
9	6. School districts may designate teachers for advanced, lead,
10	or master certificates two times per year, once prior to the
11	beginning of the school year, and once prior to the beginning of the
12	second semester. Teachers statewide who receive these designations
13	shall be placed in professional development cohorts and provided
14	additional training opportunities from the State Department of
15	Education.
16	7. After initial approval by the State Department of Education,
17	the Department shall review and validate each participating school
18	district's teacher evaluation system biennially.
19	8. The State Department of Education shall annually report the
20	school districts participating in the program, the number of
21	advanced, lead, and master certificates awarded, and the total
22	amount in state match funding that was distributed to teachers.
23	K. J. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to
24	implement a renewal schedule and associated fees for <u>advanced</u> , lead <u>,</u>

and master teaching certificates. The rules shall allow a teacher that no longer meets the requirements of a <u>an advanced</u>, lead, or master teaching certificate to make application for the standard teaching certificate.

5 <u>L. K.</u> The terms of the contracts issued to those holding
6 <u>advanced</u>, lead, and master teaching certificates shall include the
7 following:

1. Advanced: an additional five (5) days to be used to 8 9 strengthen instructional leadership. A person with an advanced 10 teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary supplement of at 11 least Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or the district's daily 12 rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for 13 which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this 14 title. This supplement shall be matched by state dollars from the 15 lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma 16 Statutes;

17 <u>2.</u> Lead: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen 18 instructional leadership. A person with a lead teaching certificate 19 shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Three Thousand 20 Dollars (\$3,000.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or the 21 district's daily rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to 22 the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-23 114.14 of this title. This supplement shall be matched by state 24

1 dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 2 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

3 2. 3. Master: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to 4 strengthen leadership. A person with a master teaching certificate 5 shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or the 6 7 district's daily rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-8 9 114.14 of this title. This supplement, up to Forty Thousand Dollars 10 (\$40,000.00), shall be matched by state dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma 11 12 Statutes.

If a person with a <u>an advanced</u>, lead, or master teaching
certificate changes school districts during the life of the
certificate, the terms of the contracts required in this subsection
shall be subject to approval by the new employing school district.

17 M. 1. Any person who is eligible for a lead or master teaching 18 certificate described in this section shall make application for the 19 following school year with the State Board of Education. The 20 application shall include a recommendation from the local board of 21 education and determination that the applicant has met the statutory 22 criteria. In reviewing an application, the local school board of 23 education and the superintendent shall consider the ability of the 24 school district to fulfill the additional requirements described in

1 subsections I and J of this section before making a recommendation
2 to the State Board of Education.

3 2. The State Department of Education shall develop an 4 application to implement the provisions of this subsection and make 5 it available to school districts.

N. L. Beginning in the 2021-2022 2022-2023 school year, the
Department shall make the teaching certificates provided for in this
section available for any person who has received a recommendation
from their local board of education his or her school district and
who meets the eligibility criteria as outlined in each school
district's teacher evaluation system provided for in subsection I of
this section.

13 O. For the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years, the Department 14 shall identify school districts to implement the teaching 15 certificates provided for in this section on a pilot program basis 16 with the assistance of public-private partnerships, funding from 17 philanthropic organizations or federal grants.

P. The Department shall seek funding M. The funding necessary for the administration of this section <u>shall be provided from the</u> Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund on a cash basis after funding and requirements are met in accordance with Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. Funding shall go toward advanced, lead, and master certificate holders on a first-come, first-served basis until the cash is exhausted for the school year. Funds from the

1 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall serve as a state match 2 to local dollars each school district contributes to their advanced, 3 lead, and master teachers as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of 4 the Oklahoma Statutes. If funding for the administration of the 5 teaching certificates listed in subsections subsection I and J is not available, the Department shall not be required to fulfill the 6 7 requirements listed in subsections K and L, M, N and O of this 8 section.

9 Q. N. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to
10 implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022. SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

16 SECTION 4. The provisions of this act shall be contingent upon 17 the enactment of the provisions of House Bill No. _____ of the 2nd 18 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature and shall not become 19 operative as law otherwise.
