1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 1st Session of the 56th Legislature (2017) 4 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1002 By: Dunlap 5 6 7 AS INTRODUCED 8 A Concurrent Resolution related to the effects of 9 pornography; making legislative findings; declaring the public health impacts and societal harms of 10 pornography; recognizing the need for education, prevention and change in policies to address 11 pornography; declaring need for regulation; and directing distribution. 12 1.3 14 WHEREAS, pornography is creating a public health crisis; and 15 WHEREAS, pornography perpetuates a sexually toxic environment; 16 and 17 WHEREAS, efforts to prevent pornography exposure and addiction, 18 to educate individuals and families concerning its harmful effects 19 and to develop recovery programs must be addressed systemically in 20 ways that hold providers accountable; and 2.1 WHEREAS, pornography is contributing to the hypersexualization 22 of teens and even prepubescent children in our society; and 23 WHEREAS, due to advances in technology and the universal 24 availability of the Internet, young children are exposed to what

1 used to be referred to as hard-core pornography but is now 2 considered mainstream pornography; and 3 WHEREAS, the average age of exposure to pornography is now 4 eleven (11) to twelve (12) years; and 5 WHEREAS, this early exposure is leading to low self-esteem and body-image disorders, an increase in problematic sexual activity at 6 7 younger ages and an increased desire among adolescents to engage in risky sexual behavior; and 8 9 WHEREAS, exposure to pornography often serves as sex education 10 for children and youth and informs their sexual templates; and 11 WHEREAS, because pornography treats women as objects and 12 commodities for the use of the viewer, it teaches girls they are to 13 be used and teaches boys to be users; and 14 WHEREAS, pornography normalizes violence and abuse of women and 15 children; and 16 WHEREAS, pornography treats women and children as objects and 17 often depicts rape and abuse as if such acts are harmless; and 18 WHEREAS, pornography equates violence towards women and children 19 with sex, and pain with pleasure, which increases the demand for sex 20 trafficking, prostitution, child sexual abuse images and child 21 pornography; and 22 WHEREAS, potential detrimental effects on users of pornography 23 can impact brain development and functioning, contribute to

emotional and medical illnesses, shape deviant sexual arousal and

lead to difficulty in forming or maintaining positive, intimate
relationships, as well as promoting problematic or harmful sexual
behaviors and addiction; and
WHEREAS, recent neurological research indicates that pornography
is potentially biologically addictive, which means the user requires
more novelty, often in the form of more shocking material, in order
to be satisfied; and
WHEREAS, this biological addiction leads to increasing themes of
risky sexual behaviors, extreme degradation, violence and child
sexual abuse images and child pornography; and
WHEREAS, pornography use is linked to lessening desire in young
men to marry, dissatisfaction in marriage and infidelity; and
WHEREAS, this link demonstrates that pornography has a
detrimental effect on the family unit; and
WHEREAS, overcoming the emotionally and psychologically damaging
effects of pornography is beyond the capability of the afflicted
individuals to address alone.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:
THAT the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma recognizes that
pornography is a public health hazard leading to a broad spectrum of

individual and public health impacts and societal harms.

1 THAT the Legislature recognizes the need for education, 2 prevention, research and policy change at the community and societal 3 level in order to address the pornography epidemic that is harming 4 the people of our state and nation. 5 THAT the Legislature recognizes products that distribute the 6 Internet are effectively pornography vending machines that are in 7 need of regulation. 8 THAT the Legislature recognizes that the manufacturers and 9 wholesalers of products that distribute the Internet have not 10 complied with the obscenity laws of the State of Oklahoma. 11 THAT copies of this Concurrent Resolution be distributed to the 12 Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and 13 the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate. 14 15 DIRECT TO CALENDAR. 16 17 18 19 20 2.1 22 23 24
