21 A Concurrent Resolution endorsing and supporting the extension of Amtrak service between Oklahoma City, 22 Oklahoma, and Newton, Kansas; urging support for the inclusion of federal funding for development of 23 Heartland Flyer Extension; urging support for the inclusion of federal funding for the maintenance and 24 development of the Southwest Chief; supporting

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approval of certain multistate partnership; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Kansas Secretary of Transportation Julie Lorenz has presented to the 2021 Passenger Rail Coalition that she and Oklahoma Secretary of Transportation Tim Gatz have discussed that both states desire that the Heartland Flyer be extended north through Oklahoma and Kansas, yet both states require federal funding to develop the corridor; and

WHEREAS, Amtrak presented a proposal for the state of Kansas February 10, 2021, at the 2021 Passenger Rail Coalition Forum to request one hundred percent (100%) federal funding for the Heartland Flyer Extension capital costs, and three (3) to five (5) years of operational costs through reauthorization of the Surface Transportation Act; and

WHEREAS, Amtrak has approached the state of Kansas to enter into a multistate operational partnership for an extended Heartland Flyer, with connecting service between Amtrak's Southwest Chief and Texas Eagle; and

WHEREAS, Amtrak has received a reauthorization act request from the Midwest Interstate Passenger Rail Commission incorporating additional frequencies and a second train over this corridor,

specifically a daytime frequency to operate between Fort Worth,
 Texas, and Kansas City, Missouri; and

3 WHEREAS, the Kansas Passenger Rail Service Development Plan of 4 2010 includes an option for additional frequencies and a second 5 train, known as Alternative No. 3, to transit the Heartland Flyer 6 and Southwest Chief corridors; and

7 WHEREAS, a concomitant improvement of ridership and financial 8 performance would be realized by an extension and second frequency 9 of the Heartland Flyer; and

10 WHEREAS, the Amtrak Southwest Chief and Sunset Limited routes 11 would realize a dramatic increase in ridership and financial 12 performance resulting from a two-frequency Heartland Flyer 13 connection with hubs in Newton, Kansas, and Fort Worth, Texas; and

14 WHEREAS, ridership on the Heartland Flyer Extension from 15 Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to Newton, Kansas, is anticipated to double 16 when connected with the Southwest Chief in Newton, Kansas. Fully 17 funded maintenance of the Southwest Chief is an integral and vital 18 component of the Heartland Flyer Extension; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Department of Transportation identifiespassenger rail development in its State Rail Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

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THAT the Senate and House of Representatives support and
 endorse the extension of Amtrak service between Oklahoma City,
 Oklahoma, and Newton, Kansas.

THAT the Senate and House of Representatives urge the Oklahoma Congressional delegation to support the inclusion of federal funding for the full implementation and development of the Heartland Flyer Extension from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to Newton, Kansas, including a second frequency directly connecting Kansas City, Missouri, with Fort Worth, Texas, in the upcoming reauthorization of the Surface Transportation Act.

11 THAT the Senate and House of Representatives urge the Oklahoma 12 Congressional delegation to support the inclusion of full federal 13 funding for the maintenance and future development of the Southwest 14 Chief in the upcoming reauthorization.

15 THAT the House of Representatives and Senate approve a 16 multistate partnership between Amtrak and the states through which 17 the service will operate.

18 THAT enrolled copies of this resolution be presented and 19 distributed to the Governor of Oklahoma, Governor of Kansas, the 20 Secretary of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the 21 Secretary of the Kansas Department of Transportation, each member of 22 the Oklahoma Congressional delegation, Secretary of the United 23 States Department of Transportation Pete Buttigieg and all 24 cosponsors of this resolution.
