1 baron", Magna Carta became the basis for the idea of natural and

inalienable rights for all citizens; and

WHEREAS, Magna Carta was one of the earliest written expressions of natural and inalienable rights, laying some of the theoretical groundwork for the English Bill of Rights of 1689, the American Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights, and the Oklahoma Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Magna Carta embodied the concept of right to due process of law, now considered to be a basic tenet of freedom, and contained the first written definition of habeas corpus; and

WHEREAS, Magna Carta contained the idea of consent of the governed, leading eventually to representative government in the form of the British Parliament, the American colonial assemblies, the Continental Congress, the United States Congress, and the state and territorial legislatures; and

WHEREAS, more importantly, Magna Carta aided in the establishment of the notion that all persons, whether king, president or magistrate, are subject to the rule of law, acknowledging the sovereignty of the people and securing individual liberty against the arbitrary whims of a tyrant; and

WHEREAS, our Founding Fathers, well aware of the history and tradition of Magna Carta, relied heavily on this document in the formation of America's great expressions of freedom - the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution.
