WHEREAS, due to the advances in technology and the universal availability of the Internet, young children are exposed to what used to be referred to as hard core pornography, now considered mainstream pornography, at an alarming rate; and

WHEREAS, twenty-seven percent (27%) of older millennials, twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) years of age, are reporting that they first viewed pornography before puberty; and

WHEREAS, early exposure is leading to low self-esteem and eating disorders, an increase in problematic sexual activity at younger ages and an increased desire to engage in risky sexual behavior as young adolescents; and

WHEREAS, children and youth are exposed to pornography which oftentimes serves as their sex education and shapes their sexual templates; and

WHEREAS, because pornography treats women as objects and commodities for the viewer's use, it teaches girls they are to be used and teaches boys to be users; and

WHEREAS, pornography normalizes violence and abuse of women and children; and

WHEREAS, pornography treats women and children as objects and often depicts rape and abuse as if such acts are harmless; and

WHEREAS, pornography equates violence toward women and children with sex and pain with pleasure, which increases the demand for sex 1 trafficking, prostitution, child sexual abuse images or child
2 pornography; and

harmful sexual behaviors and addiction; and

- WHEREAS, pornography has potential detrimental effects on users

  such as emotional, mental and medical illnesses, shaping deviant

  sexual arousal, difficulty forming or maintaining intimate

  relationships, brain development and functioning and problematic or
- 8 WHEREAS, recent research indicates that pornography is
  9 biologically addictive, which means the user requires more novelty,
  10 which is often in the form of more shocking material, in order to be
  11 satisfied. This has led to increasing themes of risky sexual
  12 behaviors, extreme degradation, violence and child sexual abuse
  13 images or child pornography; and
  - WHEREAS, pornography use has a detrimental effect on the family unit as it is linked to lessening the desire of young men to marry, dissatisfaction in marriage and infidelity.
