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8	A Concurrent Resolution declaring opposition to certain federal mandate regarding driver licenses;
9	urging the Governor to submit certain written opposition to the mandate; calling on the Legislature
10	to prevent the United States Secretary of Transportation from withholding certain
11	apportionments; and directing distribution.
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14	WHEREAS, under 23 U.S.C., Section 159(a)(3)(A), in the absence
15	of compelling circumstances warranting an exception, for an
16	individual who is convicted of a violation of the Controlled
17	Substances Act (Public Law 91-513, 84 Stat. 1236) or a drug offense,
18	a state generally must enact and enforce a law requiring:
19	1. The revocation or suspension of the driver license of the
20	individual for at least six (6) months; or
21	2. A delay in the issuance or reinstatement of the driver
22	license of the individual for at least six (6) months after the
23	individual applies for issuance or reinstatement if the individual
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1 does not have a license or has a suspended license at the time of 2 conviction; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma recognizes that although license suspensions may be appropriate tools in addressing rehabilitation and public safety goals, because the matter of driving privileges is and always has been a prerogative of a state and not the federal government, the State wishes to be relieved of the federal license suspension mandate; and

9 WHEREAS, under 23 U.S.C., Section 159(a)(3)(B), the Governor of 10 a state may submit to the United States Secretary of Transportation 11 a written certification stating that:

12 1. The Governor is opposed to the enactment or enforcement of 13 federal license suspension mandates under 23 U.S.C., Section 14 159(a)(3)(A); and

15 The Legislature has adopted a resolution expressing its 2. 16 opposition to the enactment or enforcement of federal license 17 suspension mandates under 23 U.S.C., Section 159(a)(3)(A); and 18 WHEREAS, the United States Secretary of Transportation shall 19 withhold eight percent (8%) of a state's highway-related funds 20 unless a state either enacts and enforces a law under 23 U.S.C., 21 Section 159(a)(3)(A) or the Governor of that state submits the 22 written certifications under 23 U.S.C., Section 159(a)(3)(B); and 23 WHEREAS, after considering the mandates under 23 U.S.C., Section 24 159, the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma determines that the

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1 enactment and enforcement of a law under 23 U.S.C., Section
2 159(a)(3)(A) may not be consistent with the State's goal of
3 rehabilitation as balanced with public safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, the State has already enacted sufficient laws to deter
illegal drug activity and has the capability of addressing further
concerns.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

10 THAT the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma declares its 11 opposition to the enactment and enforcement of a state law that 12 requires the suspension or revocation, or the delay in issuance or 13 reinstatement, of the driver license of an individual convicted of a 14 violation of the Controlled Substances Act or another drug offense 15 due to a federal mandate.

16 THAT the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma urges the Governor 17 to submit a written certification stating the Governor's opposition 18 to such federal mandate along with this resolution to the United 19 States Secretary of Transportation.

THAT the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma accordingly prevents the United States Secretary of Transportation from withholding a specified percentage of federal transportation apportionments under 23 U.S.C., Section 159.
