A Concurrent Resolution designating Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day and supporting efforts
to educate people about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.
WHEREAS, Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy (HCM) is a chronic
cardiovascular disease involving thickening of the heart muscle and
can potentially lead to debilitating symptoms and serious
complications including heart failure, atrial fibrillation, stroke,
and in rare cases sudden cardiac death; and
WHEREAS, HCM is the most common inheritable heart disease and
can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or ethnicity with a
reported prevalence ranging from 1 in 200 to 1 in 500 in the general
population; and
WHEREAS, an estimated 700,000 people in the United States have
HCM, yet 85 percent of them may remain undiagnosed; and

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1 WHEREAS, HCM shares symptoms with other common cardiovascular 2 and pulmonary diseases, such as shortness of breath, chest pain, fatigue, palpitations, and fainting, making it difficult to 3 distinguish HCM from these other diseases; and 4 5 WHEREAS, all-cause mortality risk is three to four times higher in patients with HCM than that of the general population; and 6 7 WHEREAS, knowing one's medical history and any signs and symptoms of HCM is an important first step in receiving an accurate 8 9 diagnosis of HCM; and 10 WHEREAS, a health care provider must conduct a thorough screening with cardiac health questions to help identify a risk of 11 cardiac disorders, both genetic and congenital; and 12 13 WHEREAS, a health care provider may conduct several tests, 14 including an echocardiogram, a cardiac MRI, or genetic testing to 15 confirm a family history of HCM, and must examine the heart to 16 diagnose HCM; and 17 WHEREAS, following a diagnosis of HCM, it is important for 18 patients to work with their health care provider to learn more about 19 their disease and understand different management options, including 20 prescription medicines and surgical treatment options that may help; 21 and 22 WHEREAS, the Legislature designates the fourth Wednesday in

23 February as Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

4 THAT the Oklahoma Legislature supports the designation of the 5 fourth Wednesday in February of each year as "Hypertrophic 6 Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" in the State of Oklahoma in order to 7 raise public awareness about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy; 8 acknowledges the critical importance of hypertrophic cardiomyopathy awareness to improve cardiovascular health in the State of Oklahoma; 9 10 supports raising awareness of the consequences of undiagnosed and 11 untreated hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and the need to seek 12 appropriate care for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy as a serious public 13 health issue; and respectfully requests the Governor to issue 14 annually a proclamation recognizing the fourth Wednesday in February 15 in the State of Oklahoma as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness 16 Day" and calls upon the people in the State of Oklahoma to observe 17 the day with appropriate programs and activities.
