No natural resource is as vital to the welfare 19 of Oklahoma as clean, accessible water, of which more than 1.5 20 trillion gallons are used every day throughout the state; and 21 WHEREAS, the proper care and management of water is vital to 22 Oklahoma due to its value to public health, industry and commerce, 23 aquatic and wildlife species, and vibrant tourism industry in

Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the 2012 Update of the Oklahoma Comprehensive Water Plan (OCWP) remains unprecedented in its review of the state's current and future water demands, water and wastewater infrastructure needs and priority water management issues; and

WHEREAS, several legislative initiatives have arisen from the recommendations contained in the OCWP to guide the management and protection of Oklahoma's water resources for the next fifty years and beyond, including the passage of House Bill 3055 in 2012 which created the Water For 2060 Act and made Oklahoma the first state in the nation to establish a bold, statewide goal of consuming no more fresh water in 2060 than was consumed in 2012 while preserving Oklahoma's population growth and economic development goals; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2015, the Water for 2060 Advisory Council submitted its final report of recommendations for achieving the goal established under the Water for 2060 Act; and

WHEREAS, the dedicated public servants of the Oklahoma Water
Resources Board are passionate about their mission of protecting and
enhancing the quality of life for Oklahomans by managing and
improving the state's water resources to ensure clean and reliable
water supplies, a strong economy and a safe and healthy environment.
That dedication and passion has resulted in the agency recently
being awarded one of The Oklahoman's Top Workplaces for the third
consecutive year.
