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14	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
15	1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
16	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
17	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
18	the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article XXVIII of
19	the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:
20	Section 3. A. The Legislature shall enact laws providing for
21	the strict regulation, control, licensing, and taxation of the
22	manufacture, sale, distribution, possession, and transportation of
23	alcoholic beverages, consistent with the provisions of this
24	Amendment. Provided, that any manufacturer, or subsidiary of any

1 manufacturer, who markets his or her product solely through a 2 subsidiary or subsidiaries, a distiller, rectifier, bottler, 3 winemaker, brewer, or importer of alcoholic beverages, bottled or 4 made in a foreign country, either within or without this state, 5 shall be required to sell such brands or kinds of alcoholic beverages to every licensed wholesale distributor who desires to 6 7 purchase the same, on the same price basis and without 8 discrimination, and shall further be required to sell such beverages 9 only to those distributors licensed as wholesale distributors. 10 Winemakers either within or without this state shall be required to 11 sell wine they produce to every licensed wholesale distributor who 12 desires to purchase the wine, but winemakers shall not be required 13 to sell the wine they produce only to licensed wholesale 14 distributors. Winemakers either within or without this state may 15 sell wine produced at the winery to adult consumers who are at least 16 twenty-one (21) years of age and are physically present on the 17 premises of the winery or at a festival or trade show. Wineries 18 either within or without this state that purchase a direct shipper's 19 permit for an amount established in statute by the Legislature or 20 are licensed by the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement 21 Commission may receive orders for, sell and ship wine directly to 22 consumers over the age of twenty-one (21) years either within or 23 without this state who have visited the winery in person and 24 purchased the wine on the premises for personal use. Winemakers

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1 either within or without this state that annually produce no more than ten thousand (10,000) gallons of wine may sell and ship only 2 the wine they produce directly to licensed retail package stores and 3 4 restaurants in this state; provided, however, that any such 5 winemaker which elects to directly sell its wine to package stores and restaurants shall not also use a licensed wholesale distributor 6 7 as a means of distribution, and shall be required to sell its wines to every package store and restaurant licensee who desires to 8 9 purchase the same, as supplies allow, on the same price basis and 10 without discrimination. As used in this section, "restaurant" means 11 an establishment that is licensed to sell alcoholic beverages by the 12 individual drink for on-premises consumption and where food is 13 prepared and sold for immediate consumption on the premises.

B. Any winemaker within or without this state that annually produces no more than ten thousand (10,000) gallons of wine and elects to directly sell its wine to retail package stores and restaurants in this state must self-distribute the wine using only vehicle(s) owned or leased by the winemaker, and without the use of a common or private contract carrier.

C. All laws passed by the Legislature under the authority of the Article shall be consistent with this provision. All provisions of this amendment are declared to be interdependent. If any provision of this amendment applicable to winemakers is ruled to be unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then no

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winemaker shall be permitted to directly sell its wine to retail
package stores or restaurants in this state.
SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
This measure amends Section 3 of Article 28 of the State
Constitution. It would allow wine to be shipped by wineries
directly to consumers who have visited the winery and purchased
the wine on the premises for personal use. The individuals
shipping the wine would need a direct shipper's permit or a
license.
SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?

SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
