The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for 1.3 14 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 15 the following proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article V of the 16 Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows: 17 Section 2. The first power reserved by the people is the 18 initiative, and eight per centum percent (8%) of the legal voters of 19 each county of this state shall have the right to propose any 20 legislative measure, and fifteen per centum percent (15%) of the 21 legal voters of each county of this state shall have the right to 22 propose amendments to the Constitution by petition, and every such 23 petition shall include the full text of the measure so proposed. 24 The second power is the referendum, and it may be ordered (except as

1	to laws necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
2	peace, health, or safety), either by petition signed by five per
3	centum percent (5%) of the legal voters of each county of this state
4	or by the Legislature as other bills are enacted. The ratio and per
5	centum of legal voters hereinbefore stated shall be based upon the
6	total number of votes cast at the last general election for the
7	Office of Governor.
8	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
9	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this act shall be in the

13	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
14	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends a
15	section pertaining to initiative and referendum petitions. The
16	amendment changes the percentage of legal voters necessary to
17	propose certain petitions from statewide to each county of this
18	state.
