14	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE									
15	1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:									
16	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for									
17	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,									
18	the following proposed amendment to Section 50 of Article V of the									
19	Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:									
20	Section 50. The Legislature shall pass no law exempting any									
21	property within this State from taxation, except as otherwise									
22	provided in this Constitution or except as provided in a measure									
23	which receives two-thirds (2/3) approval by both chambers of the

1	Legislature and becomes law as provided by the Oklahoma								
2	Constitution.								
3	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional								
4	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in								
5	the following form:								
6	BALLOT TITLE								
7	Legislative Referendum No State Question No								
8	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:								
9	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends Section 50								
10	of Article 5. This section prevents the Legislature from exempting								
11	property from property tax by statute. This measure would allow the								
12	Legislature to provide for property tax exemptions by statute if the								
13	legislation passed both the Oklahoma House of Representatives and								
14	the Oklahoma State Senate by a two-thirds $(2/3)$ vote in each chamber								
15	and became enacted as law pursuant to the other provisions of the								
16	Oklahoma Constitution.								
17	SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?

20	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
