7 [Joint Resolution - providing for the transfer of
8 monies held in the Tobacco Settlement Endowment
9 Trust Fund - creating the Community and Regional
10 Empowerment Fund - authorizing Legislature to enact
11 certain laws - ballot title - filing - ordering
12 special election]
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15 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
16 1ST SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

17 SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
18 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
19 the following proposed amendment to Section 40 of Article X of the
20 Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:

21 Section 40. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be
22 known as the "Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund". ~~The~~ Except
23 as provided by subsection H of this section, the trust fund
24 principal shall consist of the portion of monies which are received

1 by the State of Oklahoma on or after July 1, 2001, pursuant to any
2 settlement with or judgment against any tobacco company or companies
3 as provided by subsection B of this section, and any other monies
4 that may be appropriated or otherwise directed to the trust fund by
5 the Legislature.

6 B. 1. Deposits into the trust fund from monies which are
7 received by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to any settlement with or
8 judgment against any tobacco company or companies shall be based on
9 the following schedule:

Ending June 30, 2002	50%
Ending June 30, 2003	55%

18 2. ~~Deposits~~ Except as provided by subsection H of this section,
19 deposits into the trust fund in subsequent fiscal years shall never
20 be less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the payments.

21 3. The monies received by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to any
22 settlement with or judgment against any tobacco company or companies
23 after June 30, 2001, not deposited into the ~~trust fund~~ Tobacco
24 Settlement Endowment Trust Fund as provided in this section or the

1 Community and Regional Empowerment Fund as provided in Section 44 of
2 Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution, shall be deposited into a
3 special fund established by the Legislature solely for the purpose
4 of receiving the payments; provided, the Legislature may, by law,
5 direct a certain portion of such monies to the Office of the
6 Attorney General. The special fund shall be subject to legislative
7 appropriations.

8 C. There is hereby created the Board of Investors of the
9 Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund. The Board of Investors
10 shall have the duty of investing monies in the trust fund, subject
11 to restrictions and limitations provided by law for and in
12 accordance with laws applicable to the investment of monies in state
13 retirement funds.

14 The Board of Investors shall consist of five (5) members as
15 follows:

- 16 1. The State Treasurer who shall be the chair;
- 17 2. An appointee of the Governor;
- 18 3. An appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 19 4. An appointee of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
- 20 5. An appointee of the State Auditor and Inspector.

21 The initial appointees shall serve staggered terms of office as
22 provided for by law. Thereafter, appointees shall serve four-year
23 terms of office. No more than two appointees shall be appointed
24 from any single congressional district. All appointed members shall

1 have demonstrated expertise in public or private investment funds
2 management.

3 D. There is hereby created the Board of Directors of the
4 Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund. The Board of Directors
5 shall consist of seven (7) members, one appointed by each of the
6 following appointing authorities:

- 7 1. The Governor;
- 8 2. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 9 3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 10 4. The Attorney General;
- 11 5. The State Treasurer;
- 12 6. The State Auditor and Inspector; and
- 13 7. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

14 The initial appointed members shall serve staggered terms of
15 office as provided for by law. Thereafter, the appointed members of
16 the Board of Directors shall serve seven-year terms of office. At
17 least one appointee shall be appointed from each congressional
18 district, and not more than two appointees shall be appointed from
19 any single congressional district. Not more than four appointees
20 shall be members of the same political party. An appointee shall
21 have been a member of the political party to which the appointee
22 belongs for at least one (1) year prior to the date of appointment.
23 Appointees shall have demonstrated expertise in public or private
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1 health care or programs related to or for the benefit of children or
2 senior adults.

3 The Board of Directors shall meet at least one time each
4 calendar quarter.

5 E. Earnings from the trust fund, including but not limited to
6 interest, dividends, and realized capital gains from investments of
7 the trust fund shall be expended as provided in subsection F of this
8 section for the following purposes:

9 1. Clinical and basic research and treatment efforts in
10 Oklahoma for the purpose of enhancing efforts to prevent and combat
11 cancer and other tobacco-related diseases;

12 2. Cost-effective tobacco prevention and cessation programs;

13 3. Programs other than those specified in paragraph 1 of this
14 subsection designed to maintain or improve the health of Oklahomans
15 or to enhance the provision of health care services to Oklahomans,
16 with particular emphasis on such programs for children;

17 4. Programs and services for the benefit of the children of
18 Oklahoma, with particular emphasis on common and higher education,
19 before- and after-school and pre-school programs, substance abuse
20 prevention and treatment programs and other programs and services
21 designed to improve the health and quality of life of children;

22 5. Programs designed to enhance the health and well-being of
23 senior adults; and

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1 6. Authorized administrative expenses of the Office of the
2 State Treasurer and the Board of Directors.

3 F. Each fiscal year, the Board of Directors may expend the
4 amount of earnings which actually accrued to the trust fund during
5 the preceding fiscal year. Any amount not so expended shall remain
6 in the trust fund. The Board shall direct specific expenditures to
7 be made for the purposes specified in subsection E of this section.

8 G. The Except as provided by subsection H of this section, the
9 Legislature may enact laws to further implement the provisions of
10 this section.

11 H. Beginning July 1, 2021:

12 1. Ten percent (10%) of any monies paid to the State of
13 Oklahoma pursuant to the Master Settlement Agreement shall be paid
14 into the principal of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund;
15 and

16 2. Ninety percent (90%) of any monies paid to the State of
17 Oklahoma pursuant to the Master Settlement Agreement shall be paid
18 into the principal of the Community and Regional Empowerment Fund as
19 provided in Section 44 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution.

20 SECTION 2. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
21 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
22 the following proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution which
23 would add a new Section 44 to Article X thereof:

1 Section 44. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be
2 known as the "Community and Regional Empowerment Fund". Except for
3 monies deposited into a special fund as set forth in subsection B of
4 Section 40 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution, ninety percent
5 (90%) of any monies received by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to
6 the terms of the Master Settlement Agreement beginning January 1,
7 2020, shall be transferred to the Community and Regional Empowerment
8 Fund. Accretions to the principal shall be expended solely for the
9 purposes as provided in subsection E of this section. Accretions to
10 the principal shall mean the additions to the principal derived from
11 payments made pursuant to the terms of the Master Settlement
12 Agreement made during each fiscal year.

13 B. The monies deposited into the fund shall be expended based
14 on the following schedule:

9 each fiscal year thereafter

10 Expenditures from the trust fund in subsequent fiscal years shall
11 not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the accretions to principal made
12 during the fiscal year.

13 C. There is hereby created the Board of Directors of the
14 Community and Regional Empowerment Fund. The Board of Directors
15 shall consist of five (5) members; one member shall be a current
16 member of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund Board of
17 Directors and one member appointed by each of the following
18 appointing authorities:

- 19 1. The Governor;
- 20 2. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 21 3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
- 22 4. The Commissioner of Health.

23 D. Each fiscal year, subject to the requirements provided in
24 subsection B of this section, the Board of Directors shall

1 distribute the accretions to the principal made during the fiscal
2 year. The Board shall direct specific expenditures to be made for
3 the purpose specified in subsection E of this section.

4 E. Accretions to the principal shall be expended for the sole
5 purpose of benefiting rural health care, rural health care
6 infrastructure and rural health care access in Oklahoma. Any amount
7 not so distributed shall remain in the trust fund. The monies in
8 the Community and Regional Empowerment Fund shall not be
9 transferred, appropriated or diverted for any other purpose than
10 described in this subsection.

11 F. The Legislature may enact laws to further implement the
12 provisions of this section.

13 G. The unexpended balance of the fund shall be invested in a
14 manner consistent with the care, skill, prudence and diligence under
15 circumstances then prevailing that a prudent person acting in a like
16 capacity would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like
17 character and with like aims and by diversifying the investments of
18 the Community and Regional Empowerment Fund so as to minimize the
19 risk of large losses, unless under the circumstances it is clearly
20 prudent not to do so.

21 SECTION 3. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
22 amendments as set forth in SECTIONS 1 and 2 of this resolution shall
23 be in the following form:

2 THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

3 This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends
4 Section 40 of Article 10 to provide that ninety percent (90%) of
5 any monies paid to the State of Oklahoma pursuant to the Master
6 Settlement Agreement be paid into the principal of the Community
7 and Regional Empowerment Fund. It also adds Section 44 to
8 Article 10. The measure creates the Community and Regional
9 Empowerment Fund. The trust fund would be managed by a Board of
10 Directors and expended for the purpose of benefitting rural
11 health care in Oklahoma. The measure allows the Legislature to
12 pass laws to further implement this section.

16 SECTION 4. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
17 immediately after the passage of this section, shall prepare and
18 file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in
19 SECTION 3 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the
20 Attorney General.

21 SECTION 5. A special election is hereby ordered to be held
22 throughout the State of Oklahoma on the date of November 5, 2019, at
23 which time the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State
24 of Oklahoma, as set forth in SECTIONS 1 and 2 of this resolution,

1 shall be submitted to the people of Oklahoma for their approval or
2 rejection as and in the manner provided by law.
