The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for 19 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 20 the following proposed amendment to Section 23 of Article V of the 21 Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows: 22 Section 23. A. No member of the Legislature shall, during the 23 term for which he the member was elected, be appointed or elected to 24 any office or commission in the $State_{\mathcal{T}}$ which shall have been

- created, or the emoluments of which shall have been increased,

 during his the term of office, nor shall any member to which the

 member was elected.
 - B. Except as otherwise provided by this section, no former member of the Legislature shall be employed by or receive any form of compensation, payment or expense reimbursement from any state governmental entity regardless of the source of revenue until July 1 of the year following the end of the term of office for which the member shall have been elected.
 - C. The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not prohibit a former member of the Legislature from being appointed to the cabinet system of the Governor.
 - D. The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not be applicable to retirement benefit payments or distributions from a governmental tax-qualified retirement plan.
 - E. No member shall receive any appointment from the Governor, the Governor and Senate, or from the Legislature, during the term for which he the member shall have been elected, nor shall any.
 - F. Except as otherwise provided by subsection D of this section, no member shall, during the term for which he the member shall have been elected, or within two (2) years thereafter, be interested, directly or indirectly, in any contract with the State, or any county or other political subdivision thereof, authorized by

law passed during the term for which he the member shall have been elected.

G. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit a former legislator from receiving the lawful compensation provided by law upon election to another state office.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends Section 23 of Article 5 of the Oklahoma

Constitution. It would prohibit a former legislator from being employed by a state governmental entity until July 1 of the year following the end of the term of office. It would also prohibit a former legislator from receiving any form of compensation, payment or reimbursement from any state governmental entity until July 1 of the year following the end of the term of office. Former legislators could be appointed to the Governor's cabinet. Former legislators could receive retirement money and money paid into a retirement plan. This measure would allow former legislators to be paid if elected to another state office.
