## AS INTRODUCED

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of state to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 15 of Article IX of the Constitution of the state of Oklahoma; providing for additional members of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission; providing for duration of initial terms; providing for duration of terms after expiration of initial terms; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 15 of Article IX of the Constitution of the state of Oklahoma to read as follows:

Section 15. A. A Corporation Commission is hereby created, to be composed of three five (5) persons, who shall be elected by the people at a general election for state officers, and, except as otherwise provided by subsection $C$ of this section, their terms of office shall be six (6) years. In case of a vacancy in said office,
the Governor of the State shall fill such vacancy by appointment until the next general election, when a successor shall be elected to fill out any unexpired term.
B. No person shall be eligible to serve as Corporation Commissioner for a period of time in excess of twelve (12) years. Such years need not be consecutive. Any years served by a person elected or appointed to serve less than a full term to fill a vacancy in such office shall not be included in the limitation set forth herein. Any person serving in such position at the time of passage of this amendment shall be eligible to complete the term for which he or she has been elected and shall be eligible to serve an additional twelve (12) years thereafter, notwithstanding the provisions of this amendment. The Legislature is hereby authorized to enact laws to implement the provisions of this subsection.
C. At the general election held in November 2022, two
additional members shall be elected to the Oklahoma Corporation Commission. The term of office of one of the additional members shall be for a period of six (6) years. The term of office of the other additional member shall be for a period of four (4) years. After the expiration of that initial four-year term, the commissioner occupying that position shall serve for a period of six (6) years.
D. For purposes of this section, and for the determination of the initial term of office for each of the two additional members of

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the Corporation Commission authorized by this section, the following
designations shall be used:

1. Position One: The member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission who was elected to a six-year term at the general election in 2016 or who was unopposed at such election;
2. Position Two: The member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission who was elected to a six-year term at the general election in 2018 or who was unopposed at such election;
3. Position Three: The member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission who was elected to a six-year term at the general election in 2014 or who was unopposed at such election;
4. Position Four: The additional member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission elected pursuant to the provisions of this amendment who will serve an initial four-year term; and
5. Position Five: The additional member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission elected pursuant to the provisions of this amendment who will serve an initial two-year term.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends Section 15 of Article 9. The Oklahoma Corporation Commission has three (3) members. This measure would add two additional members. The term of office for both of the new positions would begin after the general election in November 2022. One of the new commissioners would serve an initial four-year term. The other new commissioner would serve an initial two-year term of office. After this general election, there would be no more than two open seats on the Corporation Commission at each General Election.
