11	A Joint Resolution expressing the legislative intent
12	of House Joint Resolution No. 1012 of the 1st Session of the 55th Oklahoma Legislature; stating that the
13	proposed constitutional amendment will ensure certain protections; stating the proposed constitutional
14	amendment is intended to prevent certain government regulations and restrictions; stating the intent of
15	the proposed constitutional amendment is to provide certain communications; and declaring an emergency.
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17	WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 1012 passed the Oklahoma
18	Legislature during the first session of Oklahoma's 55th Legislature
19	in 2015 and will propose a state question that, if approved, would
20	amend the Oklahoma State Constitution to guarantee farming and
21	ranching practices in this state.
22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
23	AND THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
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1 SECTION 1. The legislative intent of the proposed constitutional amendment in House Joint Resolution No. 1012 is to 2 ensure that Oklahoma's citizens have access to a secure, nutritious, 3 abundant and diverse food supply at a reasonable cost and to 4 5 preserve and protect agriculture as a vital part of Oklahoma's economy that provides direct employment opportunities as well as a 6 significant impact to intrastate, interstate, and international 7 commerce and trade. 8

9 The proposed constitutional amendment should be construed to 10 give the greatest possible defense and deference to Oklahoma's 11 farmers and ranchers.

12 The proposed constitutional amendment is intended to prevent 13 unreasonable regulations and government restrictions that inhibit 14 the ability of Oklahoma's farmers and ranchers to utilize their knowledge, expertise, judgment, technology and commonly accepted 15 16 standards and practices to produce food and animals. Regulations 17 should only be passed that meet a compelling state interest and only 18 be utilized when an immediate danger exists to the health, safety or 19 welfare of the public. An example of compelling state interest 20 would include, but not be limited to, protecting public drinking 21 water and preventing the growing of illegal substances.

The proposed constitutional amendment is intended to send a clear signal that Oklahoma recognizes and asserts its sovereign interest in protecting its agricultural economy and agricultural HJR1035 HFLR
