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13	WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State of Oklahoma to make wise
14	expenditures and investments; and
15	WHEREAS, in furtherance of this sound policy, and on moral
16	grounds, the State of Oklahoma is opposed to any expenditure or
17	investment that would encourage or fund acts of terrorism.
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
19	AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
20	THAT in order to ensure that taxpayer money does not directly or
21	indirectly support international acts of terrorism, the State of
22	Oklahoma and its cities, counties and other political subdivisions
23	shall not contract with or invest in any individuals, partnerships,
24	corporations or other legal entities invested in or doing business

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with countries designated by the U.S. State Department, as of January 1, 2015, as state sponsors of terrorism.

THAT any existing contracts and any existing investments shall not be renewed, and must be cancelled or divested at the earliest prudent opportunity. Under no circumstance shall such contracts, investments, or combination thereof, be in force after December 31, 2018.

THAT prohibited countries shall be added to this mandate when designated by the U.S. State Department as a state sponsor of terrorism. Countries may be removed from the prohibition list only upon their reclassification by the U.S. State Department, and an affirmative majority vote of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the State Senate and the signature of the Governor, or if the Governor vetoes the legislation, by the overriding of the Governor's veto by the House of Representatives and the Senate by a two-thirds vote of each house.
