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12	WHEREAS, approximately 200,000 Oklahomans will be newly eligible
13	for Medicaid on July 1, 2021; and
14	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority has a proven track
15	record of efficiency and physician and patient satisfaction; and
16	WHEREAS, Oklahomans are better suited than out-of-state, for-
17	profit managed care organizations to create Oklahoma-based policy
18	solutions and programs; and
19	WHEREAS, it is the duty of elected and appointed officials to
20	implement the will of the people in a fiscally responsible manner;

22	WHEREAS, privatized managed care has already been attempted and
23	failed in Oklahoma; and
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1 WHEREAS, access to and quality of care have worsened under 2 privatized managed care in other states; and WHEREAS, evidence is scant and inconclusive to suggest 3 4 privatized managed care organizations outperform their public and 5 nonprofit counterparts; and 6 WHEREAS, privatized managed care creates budget uncertainty by 7 costing Oklahoma taxpayers millions of additional dollars as it has 8 in other states; and 9 WHEREAS, privatized managed care is particularly deleterious to 10 rural Oklahomans; and 11 WHEREAS, an Oklahoma-based and housed managed care system adds 12 value by keeping Oklahoma taxpayer dollars in the Oklahoma economy. 1.3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 14 AND THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: 15 THAT privatized managed care should be rejected as an 16 inefficient and failed health care model. 17 THAT the Oklahoma Health Care Authority is hereby directed to 18 create an Oklahoma-based managed care system that serves the needs 19 of all Oklahomans in an effective and fiscally responsible manner. 20 21 58-1-8003 AB 03/30/21 22 23 24

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
