14	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE		
15	2ND SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:		
16	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for		
17	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,		
18	the following proposed amendment to Section 1 of Article XXIV of the		
19	Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:		
20	Section 1. Any amendment or amendments to this Constitution may		
21	be proposed in either branch of the Legislature, and if the same		
22	shall be agreed to by a majority of all the members elected to each		
23	of the two (2) houses, such proposed amendment or amendments shall,		
24	with the yeas and nays thereon, be entered in their journals and		

1 referred by the Secretary of State to the people for their approval or rejection, at the next regular general election, except when the 2 Legislature, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of each house, shall order a 3 4 special election for that purpose. If a fifty-five-percent majority 5 of all the electors voting on any proposed amendment at such election shall vote in favor thereof, it shall thereby become a part 6 7 of this Constitution; provided, an amendment that only repeals a provision or provisions of this Constitution shall take effect when 8 9 it has been approved by a majority of all electors voting.

No proposal for the amendment or alteration of this Constitution which is submitted to the voters shall embrace more than one general subject and the voters shall vote separately for or against each proposal submitted; provided, however, that in the submission of proposals for the amendment of this Constitution by articles, which embrace one general subject, each proposed article shall be deemed a single proposal or proposition.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:
