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L 4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L5	WHEREAS, a clear majority of Oklahoma counties are federally
L 6	designated primary care health professional shortage areas, with 75
L 7	out of 77 counties falling into that designation; and
L8	WHEREAS, 58.6% of Oklahomans reside in primary care health
L 9	professional shortage areas; and
20	WHEREAS, physician shortages negatively impact access and
21	quality of care in rural communities; and
22	WHEREAS, 55% of rural primary care physicians are 55 years of
23	age or older and 27% are 65 years of age or older; and
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1	WHEREAS, rural communities will continue to face increasing
2	challenges in recruiting and retaining physicians; and
3	WHEREAS, to address these critical rural health challenges,
4	Oklahoma State University Center for Health Sciences has launched
5	Project ECHO, the Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes
6	project; and
7	WHEREAS, Project ECHO is a collaborative model of medical
8	education and care management that empowers clinicians in rural and
9	underserved communities to provide specialty care to more people
10	right where they live; and
11	WHEREAS, Project ECHO dramatically increases access to specialty
12	treatment in rural and underserved areas by providing front-line
13	clinicians with the knowledge and support they need to manage
14	patients with complex conditions; and
15	WHEREAS, the heart of the ECHO model is its hub-and-spoke
16	knowledge-sharing networks, led by expert teams who use multi-point
17	videoconferencing to conduct virtual clinics with community
18	providers; and
19	WHEREAS, Project ECHO helps primary care doctors, nurses and
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WHEREAS, Project ECHO helps primary care doctors, nurses and other clinicians to learn to provide excellent specialty care to patients in their own communities.
