1	WHEREAS, 4-H youth across the nation continue to make a
2	difference in their cities and towns by being civically active; and
3	WHEREAS, 4-H members continue to work together to follow the 4-H
4	motto of "To Make the Best Better" in all communities across the
5	state; and
6	WHEREAS, volunteer leaders and Oklahoma 4-H members combined
7	annually contribute more than 135,000 volunteer hours of service,
8	valued at a \$2.5 million contribution back to their communities and
9	state; and
10	WHEREAS, 4-H is part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension
11	Service provided by Oklahoma State University and Langston
12	University, where youth are twice as likely to participate in
13	science, engineering and computer technology programs; and
14	WHEREAS, 4-H girls are more likely to take part in science
15	programs compared to girls in other out-of-school-time activities;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, Oklahoma's 4-H'ers are two times as likely as non-club-
18	members to make healthier choices in life.
