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11	WHEREAS, approximately 200,000 Oklahomans will be newly eligible
12	for Medicaid on July 1, 2021; and
13	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority has a proven track
14	record of efficiency and physician and patient satisfaction; and
15	WHEREAS, Oklahomans are better suited than out-of-state, for-
16	profit managed care organizations to create Oklahoma-based policy
17	solutions and programs; and
18	WHEREAS, it is the duty of elected and appointed officials to
19	implement the will of the people in a fiscally responsible manner;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, privatized managed care has already been attempted and
22	failed in Oklahoma; and
23	WHEREAS, access to and quality of care have worsened under
24	privatized managed care in other states; and

1 WHEREAS, evidence is scant and inconclusive to suggest 2 privatized managed care organizations outperform their public and 3 nonprofit counterparts; and 4 WHEREAS, privatized managed care creates budget uncertainty by 5 costing Oklahoma taxpayers millions of additional dollars as it has 6 in other states; and 7 WHEREAS, privatized managed care is particularly deleterious to 8 rural Oklahomans; and 9 WHEREAS, an Oklahoma-based and housed managed care system adds 10 value by keeping Oklahoma taxpayer dollars in the Oklahoma economy. 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 12 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: 13 THAT privatized managed care should be rejected as an 14 inefficient and failed health care model. 15 THAT the Oklahoma Health Care Authority is hereby directed to 16 create an Oklahoma-based managed care system that serves the needs 17 of all Oklahomans in an effective and fiscally responsible manner. 18 19 DIRECT TO CALENDAR. 20 21 22 23 24
