Huang; and directing distribution. 12 1.3 14 WHEREAS, for decades the United States and the Republic of China 15 (Taiwan) have fostered a close relationship that has been of mutual 16 economic, cultural, and strategic benefit; and 17 WHEREAS, bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan 18 reached \$65.3 billion in 2016, making Taiwan the 10th largest 19 trading partner of the United States as well as the largest per 20 capita importer of United States agricultural products; and 2.1 WHEREAS, Taiwan maintains biennial agricultural procurement 22 missions to the United States to sign multi-billion dollar supply 23 deals and has been actively dispatching a substantial delegation to 24 participate in the SelectUSA Investment Summit since 2013; and

WHEREAS, United States exports to Taiwan, combined with Taiwan's investment in the United States, support over 330,000 well-paid

United States jobs, and both nations could realize further economic gains through the establishment of a free trade agreement (FTA) as well as by enhancing the platforms of Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) and Digital Economy Forum (DEF); and

WHEREAS, Taiwan remains a beacon of democracy as well as the only full-fledged democracy in the Chinese-speaking world; and

WHEREAS, the results of Taiwan's 2016 presidential election, which marked both the third peaceful transition of political power since the first popular vote for President held in 1996 and the first transition of its national legislative majority since 1949, serve as proof that Taiwan is a worthy member candidate for the Communities of Democracies (CD); and

WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 has continued to be the cornerstone of relations between the United States and Taiwan for 38 years, both countries have further affirmed that Taiwan is an important and enduring economic and security partner through working in a mutually beneficial partnership to address global challenges in such areas as international humanitarian assistance, and public health and technology under the Global Cooperation and Training Framework (GCTF) established in June 2015; and

WHEREAS, travel from Taiwan to the United States has increased by more than fifty percent (50%) since the announcement of Taiwan's

1 participation in the United States Visa Waiver Program in 2012, EVA Air launched their direct Taipei-Houston route in 2015, the United 3 States and Taiwan signed a joint statement on an International 4 Expedited Traveler Initiative in 2016, all significant efforts which 5 will promote tourism and encourage exchanges between the two 6 peoples; and 7 WHEREAS, Taiwan acts as a natural hub to other Asian destinations, with Taiwan's Civil Aeronautics Administration 8 providing services for nearly 1.53 million controlled flights 10 carrying 58 million incoming and outgoing passengers annually and; 11 WHEREAS, nontraditional security threats are increasing in the 12 21st century, the meaningful participation and inclusion of Taiwan, 13 the 22nd largest economy in the world, to the International Criminal 14 Police Organization (INTERPOL), the International Civil Aviation 15 Organization (ICAO), the United Nations Framework Convention on 16 Climate Change (UNFCCC), and the World Health Assembly (WHA) would 17 be beneficial to all nations and their people; and 18 WHEREAS, this year marks the 37th anniversary of the sister-19 state relationship between Oklahoma and Taiwan, a bond nurtured 20 through mutually beneficial exchanges: 1,319 jobs in Oklahoma are 21 supported by Taiwan-affiliated companies, Oklahoma exported \$23.2 22 million in goods to Taiwan in 2016, making Taiwan the 9th largest

export market for Oklahoma in Asia.

4	the United States and Taiwan by negotiating a free trade agreement
5	between the two countries.
6	THAT, Oklahoma commends the signing of a joint statement on an
7	International Expedited Traveler Initiative between the United
8	States and Taiwan which encourages tourism.
9	THAT Oklahoma supports Taiwan's meaningful participation in the
LO	INTERPOL, ICAO, UNFCCC, and WHA.
L1	THAT Oklahoma celebrates the 37th anniversary of the sister-state
L2	relationship between the State of Oklahoma and Taiwan.
L3	THAT Oklahoma commends Mr. Louis M. Huang, Director General of
L 4	the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Houston, Texas, for
L5	efforts and contributions toward enhancing cooperation between
L6	Taiwan and Oklahoma.
L7	THAT copies of this resolution be furnished to Mr. Louis M.
