WHEREAS, this provision would give foreign corporations special rights to challenge American laws outside of our legal system by going before an international panel of arbitrators; and

WHEREAS, if the foreign corporation successfully challenged the American law, the ruling could not be challenged in United States courts, and the arbitration panel could require American taxpayers to pay millions, even billions, of dollars in damages; and

WHEREAS, President Obama has asked Congress to approve the TPP under unilateral "Fast Track" procedural rules, which limit

Congress' ability to adequately review, debate and amend the TPP and make a determination as to whether the TPP is in the best interests of the American people, as required by the United States

Constitution: and

WHEREAS, approval of the TPP would give the President of the United States almost unilateral power to make trade agreements with other nations with little congressional oversight or ability to deliberate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives strongly urges the Oklahoma Congressional Delegation to do everything within their power to resist the passage and unconstitutional implementation of the Trans-Pacific Partnership.
