9	A Resolution declaring the month of September of 2018
10	as Atrial Fibrillation Awareness Month; encouraging partnership with the State Department of Health,
11	medical communities and community-based organizations to raise awareness about atrial fibrillation and
12	stroke.
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15	WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and
16	Prevention, atrial fibrillation (AF) is the most common type of
17	irregular heartbeat; and
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	WHEREAS, atrial fibrillation consists of both valvular and
19	nonvalvular atrial fibrillation; and
20	WHEREAS, nonvalvular atrial fibrillation, which makes up
21	approximately 95 percent of AF, is estimated to affect 5.8 million
22	people in the United States; and
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1 WHEREAS, those with nonvalvular atrial fibrillation have a risk 2 of stroke that is five times greater, and approximately 15 percent of strokes are due to nonvalvular atrial fibrillation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, nonvalvular atrial fibrillation alone is estimated to 5 cost \$6.65 billion per year, and nearly 75 percent of the costs of nonvalvular atrial fibrillation represent direct and indirect costs 6 7 associated with hospitalization; and WHEREAS, in 2010, Oklahoma had the fourth highest death rate for 8 9 stroke in the nation, and in 2012 stroke was the fifth leading cause 10 of death in Oklahoma, resulting in 1,881 deaths; and 11 WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control, in 2010, 12 the stroke death rate among non-Hispanic blacks was 81 percent 13 higher than the rate among non-Hispanic whites in Oklahoma; and 14 WHEREAS, in 2015, the percentage of adults in Oklahoma who had a 15 history of having a stroke was 3.7 percent; and 16 WHEREAS, risk factors for atrial fibrillation include high blood pressure, heart failure, diabetes, advanced age, hyperthyroidism, 17 18 and heart disease; and 19 WHEREAS, modifiable lifestyle behaviors that can lead to a 20 stroke include physical inactivity, tobacco use, poor diet, and 21 heavy alcohol consumption; and 22 WHEREAS, atrial fibrillation is a serious health issue deserving 23 attention from state health officials; an increase in community 24 awareness of atrial fibrillation and its complications can improve

1	the likelihood that people with atrial fibrillation will seek the
2	treatment they need before suffering from devastating consequences.
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
4	OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
5	THAT this body encourages its members and their constituents to
6	partner with the State Department of Health, medical communities,
7	and community-based organizations to raise awareness about the risks
8	posed by atrial fibrillation and stroke, as well as the availability
9	of treatment options.
10	THAT the month of September of 2018 is hereby declared as Atrial
11	Fibrillation Awareness Month.
