The law making this phrase the national 18 motto passed through a joint resolution by the 84th Congress and was 19 signed by President Eisenhower on July 30, 1956, and is now codified 20 in 36 U.S.C., Section 186; and 21 WHEREAS, the phrase was designed as an alternative to E22 pluribus unum, which was the unofficial motto first used in 1782 23 when the Great Seal of the United States was also created; and 24

1 WHEREAS, the phrase may have originated from the words of "The 2 Star-Spangled Banner" written during the War of 1812, as the fourth 3 stanza includes the phrase, "And this be our motto - In God is our trust"; and 5 WHEREAS, the motto first appeared on U.S. coins in 1864 and on paper currency in 1957 (a one-dollar silver certificate); and 6 7 WHEREAS, Chief Historian at Antietam National Battlefield, Ted Alexander, maintains the motto was first used by the 125th 8 Pennsylvania Infantry as a battle cry on September 17, 1862. 10 the crucible of the Civil War, the Reverend M.R. Watkinson, in a 11 letter dated November 13, 1861, petitioned the Treasury Department 12 to add a statement recognizing, "Almighty God in some form in our 13 coin", perhaps as a declaration that God was on the Union side. 14 Treasury Secretary Salmon P. Chase acted on Watkinson's proposal and 15 directed the Director of the Philadelphia Mint, James Pollock, to 16 begin work on potential designs that included the phrase; and 17 WHEREAS, due to an Act of Congress dated January 18, 1837, 18 mottoes and devices that are placed on U.S. coins had to first be 19 prescribed by enacting additional legislation. Such legislation was 20 introduced and passed on April 22, 1864, allowing the Secretary of 21 the Treasury to authorize the inclusion of the phrase on one-cent

WHEREAS, the use of "In God We Trust" has not been continuous since its inception. In 2006, on the 50th anniversary of its
