Here they achieved independence and created a culture of 17 national and universal significance. Here they wrote and gave the 18 Bible to the world; and 19 WHEREAS, Israel has been granted her lands under and through the 20 oldest recorded deed, as recorded in the Old Testament, a tome of 21 scripture held sacred and revered by Jews and Christians alike as 22 presenting the acts and words of God; and 23 24

WHEREAS, the claim and presence of the Jewish people in Israel has remained constant throughout the past 4,000 years of history; and

WHEREAS, exiled from Israel, the Jewish people remained faithful to Israel in all the countries of their dispersion, never ceasing to pray and hope for their return and the restoration of their national freedom; and

WHEREAS, the Jewish people historically have been a persecuted people from the ancient time of Moses, culminating in the twentieth century Nazi Holocaust which engulfed millions of Jews in Europe, and proving anew the urgency of the reestablishment of the Jewish state, which would solve the problem of Jewish homelessness by opening the gates to all Jews and lifting the Jewish people to equality in the family of nations; and

WHEREAS, the legal basis for the establishment of the modern state of Israel was a binding resolution under international law, which was unanimously adopted by the League of Nations in 1922 and subsequently affirmed by both houses of the United States Congress; and

WHEREAS, this resolution affirmed the establishment of a national home for the Jewish people in the historical region of the Land of Israel, including the areas of Judea, Samaria, and Jerusalem; and

1 WHEREAS, Article 80 of the United Nations charter recognizes the 2 continued validity of the rights granted to states or peoples which 3 already existed under international instruments, and, therefore, the 1922 League of Nations resolution remains valid, and the 650,000 4 5 Jews currently residing in the areas of Judea, Samaria, and eastern Jerusalem reside there legitimately; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in November 1947, a great travesty was righted when the United Nations voted to partition Palestine and create a Jewish 8 9 state; and 10 WHEREAS, under the leadership of David Ben Gurion, the Nation of 11 Israel was established on May 14, 1948, and has had to defend 12 herself and her right to exist since her founding; and 13 WHEREAS, Israel declared her independence and self-governance 14 with the goal of establishing her God-given and legally recognized 15 lands as a homeland for the Jewish people; and 16 WHEREAS, the United States, having been the first nation to 17 recognize Israel as an independent nation and as Israel's principal 18 ally, has enjoyed a close and mutually beneficial relationship with 19 Israel and her people; and 20 WHEREAS, Israel is the greatest friend and ally of the United 21 States in the Middle East and the values of our two nations are so

intertwined that it is virtually impossible to separate one from the

other; and

WHEREAS, the struggle to remain a strong country, whole, complete and free from partition and free from terrorism and oppression continues today; and

WHEREAS, there are those in the Middle East who have continually sought to destroy Israel, from the time of her inception as a state, and those enemies of Israel also hate, and seek to destroy, the United States; and

WHEREAS, Israel declares that she will be open to the immigration of Jews from all countries of their dispersion; will promote the development of the country for the benefit of all her inhabitants; will be based on the precepts of liberty, justice, and peace taught by the Hebrew prophets; will uphold the full social and political equality of all her citizens, without distinction of race, creed, or sex; will guarantee full freedom of conscience, worship, education, and culture; and will safeguard the sanctity and inviolability of the shrines and holy places of all religions; and WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma and Israel have enjoyed cordial and mutually beneficial relations since 1948, a friendship that continues to strengthen with each passing year; and

WHEREAS, Israel is the only democratic state in the region and this year marks the sixty-eighth anniversary of the founding of this nation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives does hereby declare that it stands with Israel and the Jewish people in their right to live in freedom, free of terrorism in the safe and secure borders of their forefathers.

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives does hereby commend

Israel for her contribution to humankind, particularly in the fields

of science and medicine and further calls on the God of Abraham,

Isaac and Jacob to continue to bless Israel.

THAT the House of Representatives commends Israel for her cordial and mutually beneficial relationship with the State of Oklahoma and supports Israel in her legal, historical, moral, and God-given right of self-governance and self-defense upon the entirety of her own lands, recognizing that Israel is neither an attacking force nor an occupier of the lands of others, and that peace can be afforded the region only through a whole and united Israel.

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives does hereby congratulate the Nation of Israel on the occasion of the sixty-eighth anniversary of the founding of the nation.
