7	An Act relating to virtual charter school funding;
8	amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-142, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter 170, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. Supp.
9	2016, Section 3-142), which relates to state- appropriated funding; modifying the calculation of
10	state aid for full-time virtual charter schools; providing an effective date; and declaring an
11	emergency.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-142, as
15	last amended by Section 6, Chapter 170, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. Supp.
16	2016, Section 3-142), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 3-142. A. For purposes of funding, a charter school
18	sponsored by a board of education of a school district shall be
19	considered a site within the school district in which the charter
20	school is located. The student membership of the charter school
21	shall be considered separate from the student membership of the
22	district in which the charter school is located for the purpose of
23	calculating weighted average daily membership pursuant to Section
24	18-201.1 of this title and State Aid pursuant to Section 18-200.1 of

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1 this title. For charter schools sponsored by a board of education of a school district, the sum of the separate calculations for the 2 charter school and the school district shall be used to determine 3 the total State Aid allocation for the district in which the charter 4 5 school is located. A charter school shall receive from the sponsoring school district, the State Aid allocation and any other 6 7 state-appropriated revenue generated by its students for the applicable year, less up to five percent (5%) of the State Aid 8 9 allocation, which may be retained by the school district as a fee for administrative services rendered. For charter schools sponsored 10 11 by the board of education of a technology center school district, a 12 higher education institution, the State Board of Education, or a 13 federally recognized Indian tribe and for statewide virtual charter schools sponsored by the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board, the 14 State Aid allocation for the charter school shall be distributed by 15 the State Board of Education and not more than five percent (5%) of 16 17 the State Aid allocation may be charged by the sponsor as a fee for administrative services rendered. The State Board of Education 18 shall determine the policy and procedure for making payments to a 19 charter school. The fee for administrative services as authorized 20 in this subsection shall only be assessed on the State Aid 21 allocation amount and shall not be assessed on any other 22 appropriated amounts. 23

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The weighted average daily membership for the first year 1 в. 1. of operation of a charter school shall be determined initially by 2 multiplying the actual enrollment of students as of August 1 by 3 1.333. The charter school shall receive revenue equal to that which 4 5 would be generated by the estimated weighted average daily membership calculated pursuant to this paragraph. At midyear, the 6 allocation for the charter school shall be adjusted using the first 7 quarter weighted average daily membership for the charter school 8 9 calculated pursuant to subsection A of this section.

10 2. For the purpose of calculating weighted average daily membership pursuant to Section 18-201.1 of this title and State Aid 11 pursuant to Section 18-200.1 of this title, the weighted average 12 13 daily membership for the first year of operation and each year thereafter of a full-time virtual charter school shall be determined 14 15 by multiplying the actual enrollment of students as of August 1 by 1.333 1.0. The full-time virtual charter school shall receive 16 17 revenue equal to that which would be generated by the estimated weighted average daily membership calculated pursuant to this 18 paragraph. At midyear, the allocation for the full-time virtual 19 charter school shall be adjusted using the first quarter weighted 20 average daily membership actual enrollment for the virtual charter 21 school calculated pursuant to subsection A of this section 22 multiplied by 1.0. 23

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1 C. A charter school shall be eligible to receive any other aid, grants or revenues allowed to other schools. A charter school 2 sponsored by the board of education of a technology center school 3 district, a higher education institution, the State Board of 4 5 Education, or a federally recognized Indian tribe shall be considered a local education agency for purposes of funding. 6 А charter school sponsored by a board of education of a school 7 district shall be considered a local education agency for purposes 8 9 of federal funding.

10 D. A charter school, in addition to the money received from the state, may receive money from any other source. Any unexpended 11 12 funds may be reserved and used for future purposes. The governing 13 body of a charter school shall not levy taxes or issue bonds. Ιf otherwise allowed by law, the governing body of a charter school may 14 enter into private contracts for the purposes of borrowing money 15 from lenders. If the governing body of the charter school borrows 16 money, the charter school shall be solely responsible for repaying 17 the debt, and the state or the sponsor shall not in any way be 18 responsible or obligated to repay the debt. 19

E. Any charter school which chooses to lease property shall beeligible to receive current government lease rates.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
