2022, Section 51.2b), which relates to the Oklahoma
School Security Grant Program Act; providing
eligibility criteria for grant awards; directing
annual report to include certain information;
providing for noncodification; providing an effective
date; and declaring an emergency.

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17 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause, and entire bill
and insert:

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"An Act relating to school security; creating the
School Resource Officer Grant Program; directing
State Department of Education to administer program;
providing for program purpose; establishing program
qualifications; providing duties for program school
resource officers; requiring completion of certain
law enforcement training; defining term; providing
for codification; providing an effective date; and
declaring an emergency.

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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-148.2 of Title 70, unless
4 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 A. The State Department of Education shall establish and
6 maintain the School Resource Officer Grant Program.

7 B. The purpose of the School Resource Officer Grant Program
8 shall be to improve school safety and enhance campus security by
9 providing startup grants for school resource officer programs at
10 public and private schools in rural or underserved areas.

11 C. To qualify for an award from the program, a public school
12 district shall agree to:

13 1. Employ a school resource officer or enter into a contract or
14 memorandum of understanding with a local law enforcement agency for
15 the services of a school resource officer; and

16 2. Provide fifty percent (50%) matching funds, which may be
17 provided in partnership with a local law enforcement agency.

18 D. Duties of a school resource officer employed or contracted
19 by school districts participating in the School Resource Officer
20 Grant Program shall include but shall not be limited to assisting
21 school administration in ensuring the physical safety of school
22 buildings and the individuals in the school buildings and shall not
23 include student discipline issues that administration personnel are
24 required to handle.

1 E. School resource officers employed or contracted by school
2 districts participating in the School Resource Officer Grant Program
3 shall successfully complete law enforcement active shooter emergency
4 response training given by the Council on Law Enforcement Education
5 and Training (CLEET) and approved by the Oklahoma Department of
6 Public Safety.

7 F. For purposes of this section, "school resource officer"
8 means a law enforcement officer with sworn authority and training in
9 school-based law enforcement and crisis response who is assigned by
10 an employing law enforcement agency to work collaboratively with one
11 or more schools using community-oriented policing concepts.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

13 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
14 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
16 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

21 A. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Department of
22 Emergency Management from any monies not otherwise appropriated from
23 the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
24 ending June 30, 2024, the sum of Twenty Million Dollars
(\$20,000,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to be
deposited in the Oklahoma School Security Revolving Fund created
pursuant to Section 51.2c of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to

1 administer the Oklahoma School Security Grant Program created
2 pursuant to Section 51.2b of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

3 B. Of the funds appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this
4 section:

5 1. Eighty-five percent (85%) shall be used to provide Oklahoma
6 School Security Grant Program grants to public schools, technology
7 center schools, and private schools; and

8 2. Fifteen percent (15%) shall be used to provide Oklahoma
9 School Security Grant Program grants to institutions of higher
10 learning.

11 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 51.2b, as
12 amended by Section 5, Chapter 302, O.S.L. 2022 (74 O.S. Supp. 2022,
13 Section 51.2b), is amended to read as follows:

14 Section 51.2b. A. This section shall be known and may be cited
15 as the "Oklahoma School Security Grant Program Act".

16 B. The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall
17 solicit proposals for and make grants for the enhancement of campus
18 security at institutions of higher learning, technology center
19 schools, public schools, and private schools.

20 C. The goals and objectives of the Oklahoma School Security
21 Grant Program are to:

22 1. Increase the awareness of the public and educational
23 institutions of the risks, threats, and vulnerabilities of school
24 campuses as well as mitigation strategies;

1 2. Incentivize participation in school security training
2 programs designed to assess campus risks, threats, and
3 vulnerabilities;

4 3. Provide assistance to institutions of higher learning,
5 technology center schools, public schools, and private schools
6 initiating or implementing school security plans, programs, and
7 activities; and

8 4. Build upon the success of the pilot Education Grant Program
9 established by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.

10 D. The Department shall determine grant project criteria and
11 establish a process for the consideration of proposals. The
12 proposals shall be considered on a statewide competitive basis among
13 peer institutions. To be eligible for an Oklahoma School Security
14 Grant Program award, an institution of higher learning, technology
15 center school, public school, or private school shall:

16 1. Have undergone a risk and vulnerability assessment conducted
17 by the Oklahoma School Security Institute; and

18 2. Agree to expend grant funds on items recommended by the risk
19 and vulnerability assessment and/or to provide behavioral threat
20 assessment and management training to employees.

21 E. On or before January 1, 2010, and each year thereafter, the
22 Department shall prepare an annual report on the Oklahoma School
23 Security Grant Program and submit the report to the Governor, the
24 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of

1 Representatives. The report shall include a list of the recipients
2 of Oklahoma School Security Grant Program awards and information on
3 how grant funds were used during the previous year.

4 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

5 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
7 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
