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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 87, O.S.L. 2015
14	(26 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 4-109.4), is amended to read as
15	follows:
16	Section 4-109.4. A. A person may submit a voter registration
17	application electronically as provided in this section if such
18	person:
19	1. Has a current and valid Oklahoma driver license or
20	identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety
21	pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-101 et seq. of Title 47 of
22	the Oklahoma Statutes;
23	2. Is registering to vote at the address shown on the driver
24	license or identification card; and
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(Bold face denotes Committee Amendments)

3. Is a qualified elector and entitled to become a registered
 voter as provided by law.

3 The Secretary of the State Election Board, subject to Β. available funding, shall establish a secure website to permit 4 5 persons described in subsection A of this section to submit voter registration applications electronically. The website must permit 6 7 such persons to submit an application to register to vote or to update an existing registration. The Secretary may employ security 8 9 measures he or she deems necessary to ensure the accuracy and 10 integrity of voter registration applications submitted 11 electronically and may establish an initial date on which voter 12 registration applications may be submitted electronically after 13 establishment of the website.

C. 1. The applicant must attest to the truth of the information provided on the application by affirmatively accepting the information as true and correct. Any person who submits false information on an electronic voter registration application shall be deemed guilty of a felony as described in Sections 16-103 and 16-19 103.1 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

20 2. The applicant must affirmatively consent to the use of his 21 or her driver license or identification card <u>record and</u> signature 22 for voter registration purposes.

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3. A voter registration application properly submitted
 electronically shall be considered by the State Election Board in
 the same manner as a registration application submitted by mail.

D. <u>1.</u> When an applicant submits a voter registration
application electronically, the Secretary shall generate an
electronic confirmation on the website that the application has been
received, with instructions as to how the applicant may check the
status of the application thereafter.

9 2. In addition, the Secretary shall obtain a digital copy compare the information contained in the record of the applicant's 10 11 driver license or identification card from of the Department of 12 Public Safety and shall compare with the information submitted on the application to the information shown on the digital copy and 13 ensure that the information on the application substantially matches 14 the information in the driver license or identification card record. 15 3. If the Secretary finds that the application is in compliance 16

17 with this section and all applicable laws relating to voter
18 registration, the digital signature <u>contained in the driver license</u>
19 <u>or identification card record</u> of the applicant shall be <u>obtained</u>
20 <u>from the Department of Public Safety and</u> included on the application
21 and the application shall be processed as provided by law.
22 <u>Provided, the Secretary of the State Election Board may utilize an</u>

23 alternative method of obtaining the signature of the applicant, if

24 <u>necessary</u>.

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 notified that the application has been rejected and the reasons for
 such rejection.

The provisions of Section 24A.5 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma 4 Ε. 5 Statutes relating to confidentiality of personal information within 6 driver records as defined by the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 7 United States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725, shall be applicable to information obtained by the State Election Board from voter 8 9 registration applications or digital copies of driver licenses or 10 identification cards pursuant to the provisions of this section. F. The Secretary shall have the authority to promulgate rules 11 12 as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this section. 13 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-112, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 87, O.S.L. 2015 (26 O.S. Supp. 2015, 14

15 Section 4-112), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 4-112. A. The Secretary of the State Election Board 17 shall devise and distribute a registration application form to be 18 used for registering voters. Such registration application shall 19 contain the following information:

The applicant's full name and date of birth, county and
 place of residence, and mailing address pursuant to the provisions
 of subsection G of this section;

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2. The names of political parties <u>A space or section to</u>
 <u>designate a political party</u> recognized by the laws of the State of
 Oklahoma with which the applicant may <u>chooses to</u> be affiliated;

3. The Oklahoma driver license or identification card number if
the applicant has been issued a current and valid driver license or
identification card by the Department of Public Safety, or if the
applicant does not have a valid Oklahoma driver license or
identification card, the last four digits of the voter's social
security number;

An oath of the eligibility of the applicant to become a
 registered voter; and

5. Such other information as may be deemed necessary by the Secretary to identify such applicant and to ascertain his or her eligibility.

B. A voter registration application shall be signed by the 15 applicant in writing. The applicant shall personally subscribe his 16 or her name to or make his or her mark on the application, and no 17 agent, representative or employee of the applicant may sign or mark 18 on the applicant's behalf. The signature or mark must be the 19 original, handwritten signature, autograph or mark of the applicant. 20 No facsimile, reproduction, typewritten or other substitute 21 signature, autograph or mark will be valid. Notwithstanding any law 22 to the contrary, the Secretary of the State Election Board shall 23 prescribe procedures to authorize any person incapable of personally 24

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1 making a mark to complete a voter registration application with assistance of an official of any voter registration agency or motor 2 3 license agency specified in Sections 4-109.2 and 4-109.3 of this title. Provided, for applications submitted electronically, in lieu 4 5 of the signature requirements set forth in this subsection, the applicant shall affirmatively consent to the use of his or her 6 7 driver license or identification card signature as provided in Section 1 of this act. 8

9 C. Persons who do not indicate a recognized political party or 10 political organization on their registration application shall be 11 designated as Independents Independent (no party).

D. Any person may apply in writing to the Secretary of the State Election Board for permission to print, copy or otherwise prepare and distribute the registration applications designed by the Secretary of the State Election Board. The Secretary may revoke any such permission at any time.

E. All registration applications shall be distributed to thepublic at no charge.

F. The Secretary also shall prescribe procedures to accept and
use federal registration applications the National Mail Voter
<u>Registration Form, or its successor</u>, as required by the National
Voter Registration Act of 1993. <u>Provided, the form shall include an</u>
<u>original, handwritten signature, autograph or mark as described in</u>
<u>subsection B of this section.</u>

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1 G. Applicants for voter registration or for change of voter 2 registration in any way shall provide a residence address and, if 3 different from the residence address, a mailing address. A residence address shall include the street address of the residence, 4 5 including a full house number, street name or number, apartment or suite number, if applicable, and zip code. If a street address is 6 7 not available for the residence, applicants shall provide such information as the Secretary of the State Election Board deems 8 9 necessary for voter registration purposes. A post office box may 10 not be given as a residence address. A mailing address, which shall 11 include the city and zip code, may be the actual emergency 12 notification or 911 address on file in the local community, a rural route and box number, a post office box number or a street address. 13 H. A full or partial Social Security number or driver license 14 15 number in a voter registration record or a voter registration 16 application shall be kept confidential by the State Election Board and each county election board, except by order of a court of record 17 18 in this state. SECTION 3.
