7 An Act relating to commercial driver licenses;
8 amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-111, as last amended
9 by Section 4, Chapter 266, O.S.L. 2015 (47 O.S. Supp.
10 2015, Section 6-111), which relates to commercial
11 driver licenses; authorizing certain driver licenses
12 to be issued; stating requirements; allowing rules
13 for implementation; and providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-111, as
16 last amended by Section 4, Chapter 266, O.S.L. 2015 (47 O.S. Supp.
17 2015, Section 6-111), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 6-111. A. 1. The Department of Public Safety shall,
19 upon payment of the required fee, issue to every applicant
20 qualifying therefor a Class A, B, C or D driver license or
21 identification card as applied for, which license or card shall bear
22 thereon a distinguishing alphanumeric identification assigned to the
23 licensee or cardholder, date of issuance and date of expiration of
24 the license or card, the full name, signature or computerized
signature, date of birth, residence address, sex, a color photograph

1 or computerized image of the licensee or cardholder and security
2 features as determined by the Department. The photograph or image
3 shall depict a full front unobstructed view of the entire face of
4 the licensee or cardholder; provided, a commercial learner permit
5 shall not bear the photograph or image of the licensee. When any
6 person is issued both a driver license and an identification card,
7 the Department shall ensure the information on both the license and
8 the card are the same, unless otherwise provided by law.

9 2. A driver license or identification card issued by the
10 Department on or after March 1, 2004, shall bear thereon the county
11 of residence of the licensee or cardholder.

12 3. The Department may cancel the distinguishing number, when
13 that distinguishing number is another person's Social Security
14 number, assign a new distinguishing alphanumeric identification, and
15 issue a new license or identification card without charge to the
16 licensee or cardholder.

17 4. The Department may promulgate rules for inclusion of the
18 height and a brief description of the licensee or cardholder on the
19 face of the card or license identifying the licensee or cardholder
20 as deaf or hard-of-hearing.

21 5. It is unlawful for any person to apply, adhere, or otherwise
22 attach to a driver license or identification card any decal,
23 sticker, label, or other attachment. Any law enforcement officer is
24 authorized to remove and dispose of any unlawful decal, sticker,

1 label, or other attachment from the driver license of a person. The
2 law enforcement officer, the employing agency of the officer, the
3 Department of Public Safety, and the State of Oklahoma shall be
4 immune from any liability for any loss suffered by the licensee,
5 cardholder, or the owner of the decal, sticker, label, or other
6 attachment caused by the removal and destruction of the decal,
7 sticker, label, or other attachment.

8 6. The Department of Public Safety may develop by rule an
9 alternative procedure whereby a person may apply for a renewal or
10 replacement Oklahoma Class D license or Oklahoma identification
11 card.

12 B. The Department may issue a temporary permit to an applicant
13 for a driver license permitting such applicant to operate a motor
14 vehicle while the Department is completing its investigation and
15 determination of all facts relative to such applicant's privilege to
16 receive a license. Such permit must be in the immediate possession
17 of the driver while operating a motor vehicle, and it shall be
18 invalid when the applicant's driver license has been issued or for
19 good cause has been refused.

20 C. 1. The Department may issue a restricted commercial driver
21 license to ~~seasonal~~ drivers eighteen (18) years of age or older for
22 any of the following specific farm-related service industries:

- 23 a. farm retail outlets and suppliers,
- 24 b. agri-chemical businesses,

1 c. custom harvesters, and

2 d. livestock feeders.

3 The applicant shall hold a valid Oklahoma driver license and
4 shall meet all the requirements for a commercial driver license.

5 The restricted commercial driver license shall not exceed a total of
6 one hundred eighty (180) days within any twelve-month period.

7 2. The restricted commercial driver license shall not be valid
8 for operators of commercial motor vehicles beyond one hundred fifty
9 (150) miles from the place of business or the farm currently being
10 served. Such license shall be limited to Class B vehicles. Holders
11 of such licenses who transport hazardous materials which are
12 required to be placarded shall be limited to the following:

13 a. diesel fuel in quantities of one thousand (1,000)
14 gallons or less,

15 b. liquid fertilizers in vehicles with total capacities
16 of three thousand (3,000) gallons or less, and

17 c. solid fertilizers that are not mixed with any organic
18 substance.

19 No other placarded hazardous materials shall be transported by
20 holders of such licenses.

21 D. The Department may issue a non-domiciled commercial learner
22 permit or a non-domiciled commercial driver license to:

23 1. An H2A-Temporary Agricultural worker lawfully present in the
24 United States as indicated on an original, valid and unexpired I-94

1 immigration status document issued by the United States Customs and
2 Immigration Service; and

3 2. A J-1 Exchange Visitor Program participant lawfully present
4 in the United States as indicated on a valid and unexpired J-1
5 Visitor Visa issued by the United States Customs and Immigration
6 Service.

7 A person applying for such permit or license must comply with
8 all testing and licensing requirements in accordance with applicable
9 federal regulations, state laws and Department rules. The issued
10 license shall be valid until the expiration of the visa for the non-
11 domiciled worker. The Department may promulgate rules for the
12 implementation of the process to carry out the provisions of this
13 section.

14 E. 1. The Department shall develop a procedure whereby a
15 person applying for an original, renewal or replacement Class A, B,
16 C or D driver license or identification card who is required to
17 register as a convicted sex offender with the Department of
18 Corrections pursuant to the provisions of the Sex Offenders
19 Registration Act and who the Department of Corrections designates as
20 an aggravated or habitual offender pursuant to subsection J of
21 Section 584 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be issued a
22 license or card bearing the words "Sex Offender".

23 2. The Department shall notify every person subject to
24 registration under the provisions of Section 1-101 et seq. of this

1 title who holds a current Class A, B, C or D driver license or
2 identification card that such person is required to surrender the
3 license or card to the Department within one hundred eighty (180)
4 days from the date of the notice.

5 3. Upon surrendering the license or card for the reason set
6 forth in this subsection, application may be made with the
7 Department for a replacement license or card bearing the words "Sex
8 Offender".

9 4. Failure to comply with the requirements set forth in such
10 notice shall result in cancellation of the person's license or card.
11 Such cancellation shall be in effect for one (1) year, after which
12 time the person may make application with the Department for a new
13 license or card bearing the words "Sex Offender". Continued use of
14 a canceled license or card shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall,
15 upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine of not less than
16 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), nor more than Two Hundred Dollars
17 (\$200.00). When an individual is no longer required to register as
18 a convicted sex offender with the Department of Corrections pursuant
19 to the provisions of the Sex Offenders Registration Act, the
20 individual shall be eligible to receive a driver license or
21 identification card which does not bear the words "Sex Offender".

22 ~~E.~~ F. Nothing in subsection ~~D~~ E of this section shall be deemed
23 to impose any liability upon or give rise to a cause of action
24 against any employee, agent or official of the Department of

1 Corrections for failing to designate a sex offender as an aggravated
2 or habitual offender pursuant to subsection J of Section 584 of
3 Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

4 ~~F.~~ G. The Department shall develop a procedure whereby a person
5 subject to an order for the installation of an ignition interlock
6 device shall be required by the Department to submit their driver
7 license for a replacement. The replacement driver license shall
8 bear the words "Interlock Required" and such designation shall
9 remain on the driver license for the duration of the order requiring
10 the ignition interlock device. The replacement license shall be
11 subject to the same expiration and renewal procedures provided by
12 law. Upon completion of the requirements for the interlock device,
13 a person may apply for a replacement driver license.

14 ~~G.~~ H. The Department shall develop a procedure whereby a person
15 applying for an original, renewal or replacement Class D driver
16 license who has been granted modified driving privileges under this
17 title shall be issued a Class D driver license which identifies the
18 license as a modified license.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
